>> THE CATHOLIC ENGLISH SERVICE MASS IN MADEIRA:

Welcome to the Chapel of Penha de França! Our priest for the

English Service Mass on Sundays is Fr. Bernardino Andrade. He was born here in Madeira, but spent many years as a priest in California, USA.

The Chapel of Penha de França was founded by Antonio Dantas in 1622. It was built on a "penha" or peak, by the sea, originally to minister to the soldiers of the small garrison at the Pontinha Redoubt (stronghold) in the bay of Funchal, but the Chapel soon became so famous a shrine that people came to it on pilgrimage from all parts of the Island. In 1721 the chapel was restored and enlarged. When the Diocese of Funchal took possession of the chapel it was used as the Bishop's Summer Residence for many years. In the meantime, the Franciscans had been coming to Madeira to carry out apostolic duties, and in 1935, they founded the Franciscan Residence of Our Lady of Penha de França here, at the request of Bishop D. Antonio Ribeiro.

In 2015 the Franciscans moved to the former convent of São Bernardino in the town of Câmara de Lobos, and the Chapel has reverted back to the Diocese of Funchal. The nave roof of the Chapel has recently been repaired and the ceiling restored through the generosity of a frequent visitor to our English Mass.

Today's Scripture Readings

(Amos 6:1, 4-7, Ps 145:6-10,1 Tim 6:11-16, Lk 16:19-31)

Amos warns both the northern kingdom, Israel, ie Samaria, and the southern kingdom, Judah, with its capital Zion or Jerusalem, that the idle rich in both kingdoms will be the first to go into exile. 40 years later, in 721 BC, Samaria was conquered, and later Judea followed into exile.

The Psalm, echoed by Mary in Luke's Magnificat, confirms that God's justice will prevail: the hungry will be fed, the blind given sight, but the wicked will lose out. The Gospel graphically illustrates this theme: the rich man, who is not named, asks that the poor man – who is named – Lazarus – be sent to relieve his torments in hell. Abraham tells him the rich should listen to the prophets.

Instructing Timothy how to organise the early Christian church, Paul also insists the rich should use their wealth for good deeds. Christians should ideally aspire to show all the Christian virtues as examples to all, and so witness to the truth, until our Lord Jesus Christ returns to appear in glory as King of kings. And Paul insists that only God "has immortality": we do not simply have souls that live on after death – our creed says we believe in "the resurrection of the body", a gift from God in which our whole person, body and soul, lives forever.



Lise, an English army girl, falls on hard times and becomes a prostitute after the liberation of Paris in World War II. Within a short time, she becomes the leading Madame in one of Paris' smartest brothels owned by a man named Patrice. But Patrice soon tires of Madame Lise as his mistress and she is humiliated. In trying to help a younger prostitute escape from the same fate she suffered, Lise shoots and kills Patrice. So she is sent to prison where she meets the French Dominican Sisters of Bethanie.

The French Dominican Sisters of Bethanie is a community dedicated to serving prostitutes, drug addicts and vagrants; some of the sisters were once themselves such unfortunates.

Lise becomes one of the Sisters of Bethanie. Sister Lise is a prototype of the lost sheep, *the lost coin and the lost son* (Lk 15). God's Grace is greater than our sins.

The story of the Good Shepherd, told by Jesus, is a «scandalous» story. In the Religious Community of Bethany there are former prostitutes,



drug addicts and dirty homeless who became nuns, passionately in love with Jesus and His project. Only love, not cruel rules, are able to save and free people from their miseries and their sins and restore their dignity.

My friend Claudia Silva (Rosario Santos' daughter) told me during supper at her mother's house:

- « If you tell a homeless, a drug addict, a prostitute, a robber, a murderer, a sexual abuser: "You have dignity, you are beautiful, there is hope for you, heaven is waiting for you, you deserve to be happy and make other people happy, the world needs you because you are a



human being and you have many talents, there's a special place reserved in heaven for you, because **God loves you** without any conditions.", he/she will not believe you; But if you treat him/her like an animal and say: "You are no more than a piece of garbage, hell is waiting for you, you deserve all the suffering you got because it is all your fault, all the world wants you to be dead, all the 'good' institutions are tired of you and would be happy to

get rid of you.", he/she will believe you. ».

PADRE PIO OF PIETRELCINA - Feast Day on September 23rd

Padre Pio was an Italian priest, born in 1887 in the town of Pietrelcina, Italy. He was known for his piety and charity and the quality of his preaching, as well as for the gift of the stigmata, which has never been explained.

In 1947, Fr. Karol Wojtyla visited Padre Pio who prophetically told him he would rise to the highest post in the Church... Fr. Karol Wojtyla became Pope John Paul II in 1978.

Padre Pio, at the age of 5, dedicated his life to God. He was able to see and communicate with not only his guardian angel, but also with Jesus and the Virgin Mary. This was not something that was taught to him, but occurred so naturally that he assumed other people could see them too.

Padre Pio loved to pray the Rosary and recommended it to others.

The marks of the stigmata, the wounds of Christ, appeared on Padre Pio's body on Friday, September 20th, 1918, while he was praying before a crucifix and making his thanksgiving after Mass. **He was 31 years old and became the first stigmatized priest in the history of the Church.** With resignation and serenity, he bore the painful wounds in his hands, feet, and side for 50 years. **The wounds smelled of roses, and although they continued to weep, they never became infected.** Many miracles have been also attributed to his intercession.



God endowed Padre Pio with many extraordinary spiritual gifts and charisms including the gift of healing, prophecy, miracles, discernment of spirits, the ability to read hearts, the gift of tongues (the ability to speak and understand languages that he had never studied), the gift of conversions, etc. He famously advised, *«Pray, hope and don't worry.»*

Padre Pio died on September 23rd, 1968. His funeral was attended by over 100,000 people. Padre Pio's body was exhumed intact in 2008. He was beatified in 1999 and canonized in 2002 by Pope John Paul II. His feast day is September 23rd. You can read more about Padre Pio and his miracles at:




PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE
