Christ the King

THE CATHOLIC ENGLISH SERVICE MASS IN MADEIRA:

Welcome to the Chapel of Penha de França. Today we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, and also the last Sunday of the Liturgical year. We hope you enjoy today's special edition of the Newsletter, which has news about *People Helping People*, a project that was started by a group of volunteers at this Chapel 6 years ago, after the devastating floods on our island, and which has now become an official Association! Our priest for the English Service Mass this Sunday morning is **Father Bernardino Andrade**. He was born here in Madeira, and was ordained as a priest in Africa, 51 years ago! He also spent many years as a priest in California, before returning to Madeira a few years ago. Besides this English service Mass held here every Sunday morning at 10am, there is also a Portuguese service Mass on Saturdays at 18h30 and on Sundays at 11h30 (straight after the English service).

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(2 Sam 5:1-3... Ps 121... Col 1:12-20... Lk 23:35-43)

The Books of Samuel, with the Books of Kings and of Judges, tell of Israel's history from when they entered Canaan about 1200 BC, up to their exile to Babylon in 587 BC. After the death of Saul, David became King of Judah. In today's key reading David then becomes King of all Israel. He goes on to capture the 1,000 year-old city of Jerusalem, and makes it his capital. He then brings the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem, making it also Israel's religious centre. The Psalm celebrates Jerusalem, David's city.

The letter to the Colossians was written because they thought that angelic beings and other spiritual powers were either rivals to Christ or were needed to supplement Christ's work. Paul says this detracts from the person of Jesus Christ, who possesses the totality of power needed for redemption, meaning the forgiveness of sins. The hymn praises Christ, who is the image of the creation. He has reconciled all things, the whole cosmos, by "the blood of the Cross".

In Luke's Gospel the crucified Jesus is recognised as King, both by the good thief and in the inscription written by Pilate, a Gentile.

People Helping People – A new Association of Solidarity

February 20, 2010 is a date that marked the history of Madeira Island. A devastating flood destroyed part of this «Pearl of the Atlantic». Many people became poor and the poor became poorer.

I have learned, long time ago, that the opposite of love is not hatred. The opposite of love is indifference. It was a tragedy that took many lives, destroyed streets and bridges, devastated many houses and dumped many cars into the ocean. It would be impossible to be indifferent.

A small group of people, attending the English Mass, decided to do something about that and *«People Helping People»* was born. No rules, no schedules. Just loving people trying to alleviate the suffering of hurting people.

Only three things were needed: people, financial resources and non-judgmental love. Some people volunteered to go to the field. Non-judgmental love was their fuel. Financial

resources started coming from the generous tourists attending the English Mass. Since then, every Sunday, there has been someone at the front door of the chapel with a bag where people have been dropping their anonymous but generous offerings. The slogan is «find a hurt and heal it. Find a need and fill it». The logotype is Jesus washing dirty feet (Jo.13:14) (*which you can see on the last page of this newsletter*).

The main needs that torment the poor are hunger in need of food, illnesses in need of medicine, homeless in need of a roof, electricity, water and rent bills to be paid, houses in need to be repaired. The list is endless.

People Helping People a new institution? I confess that I have been so traumatized and I have seen so many needy people being traumatized and humiliated by some cruel and ridiculous rules of some cruel and ridiculous institutions that I could never imagine to get to the point where I would need a bunch of rules to tell me when and how should I help my brothers and sisters in need. My biggest inspiration or rule comes from the Gospel. In every human being I see Jesus (Math. 25:40). When I want to help Jesus I ask Him how could I help Him. When I want to help the poor, they are the ones who make the

agenda. My question should be the same: «How can I help you»? Our model is Jesus, the Good Shepherd, who leaves ninety-nine and goes until He finds the lost sheep. When

He finds her she is dirty, smelling terrible, wounded, and trembling with cold. No questions asked. He approaches her with tenderness, with tears in His eyes puts her on His shoulders and brings her back to the flock (Lk. 15).

We don't ask the poor if they «deserve». We ask them if they «need». If they need, they deserve. If one day we have two people in need and we choose to help the «well behaved» instead of the «bad behaved», in that day the curse of God enters in our group, which like Jesus, came to save the one who is lost (Lk. 19:10)

We still believe that People Helping People should be a way of life and not an institution for just a group of «volunteers». However, in order to survive and be able to do a better organized job we decided to make *People Helping*

People an official Association.

On November 11, 2016, PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE became an official Association, signed by 24 members, under the leadership of 10 qualified people, approved by a Government representative under the Portuguese name of «GENTE AJUDANDO GENTE»; that is the literal translation of «People Helping People». Soon we will open a Bank account under its official name.

I want to thank all of those who trusted in us and have been a priceless channel of the mercy of God, towards the afflicted, the hungry, the unlovable, the lonely and the sick.

POPE FRANCIS ASKS THE POOR FOR FORGIVENESS



On November 11th, 2016, in a moving ceremony in a Vatican auditorium, Pope Francis stood silently with his head bowed as he let several homeless people place their hands on his shoulders or clutch his cassock. In the auditorium were thousands of poor, homeless and marginalized persons who had travelled to Rome to attend the Jubilee of Socially Excluded Persons. Pope Francis spoke a few words in Spanish

to those who were there, saying:

«Thank you all for coming here. May your hands upon my head give me strength to continue my mission. I ask for forgiveness if I ever offended you with my words or for not saying what I should say. I ask for forgiveness in the name of the Christians who don't read the Gospel, finding poverty at its core. I ask for forgiveness for all the times Christians, when faced with a poor person or a situation of poverty, looked the other way. Pardon. Your forgiveness in the face of men and women of the church who don't or won't want to look at you, is holy water for us, it's cleansing for us.

The dream of a poor person, of someone who doesn't have a roof, what is it like? I don't know. But dream. You dreamt that one day you might come to Rome, and that dream came true. Dream that the world can change; that might be the seed that's born from your heart. Teach us, all of us who have a roof, who have no lack of food or medicine, teach us not to be satisfied. With your dreams, teach us to dream, starting from the Gospel,

where you are, from the heart of Gospel. Wars are made between the rich. To have more. To possess more territory, more power, more money. And it's very sad when war is waged amongst the poor, because it's rare. The poor have, because of their own poverty, a bigger propensity to be peace artisans. Make peace, create peace, give examples of peace. We need peace in the world. We need peace in the Church. »

STATUE OF "HOMELESS JESUS" - gets a blessing from the Pope

Did you know that a bronze statue of Jesus, depicted as a homeless man sleeping on a park bench, has been blessed by Pope Francis? The statue with crucifixion wounds on its feet, was created by Canadian sculptor, Timothy Schmalz, who travelled to Rome in 2013 to present his "Jesus the Homeless" statue to the Pope. "The first

thing he did when he saw my sculpture was he prayed, and then he blessed the piece," says Schmalz. He was inspired to create the statue after seeing a homeless person wrapped in a blanket in Toronto. The life-size sculpture took 8 months to build.

PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE (PHP)

People Helping People (PHP) is a small project founded in the Chapel of Penha de França to help those in need. Our Bishop D. António once said, "One must find new ways of helping the poor".

A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that! In a short period of time we have created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants, we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

A sincere thank you to the owners and staff of Moynihans Irish Bar (located on the corner up the road from the Chapel), who have always been a great support towards the *People Helping People Project*, and who willingly accept any clothes, or toiletries, or tinned food that you may wish to donate towards PHP.
