THE CATHOLIC ENGLISH MASS IN MADEIRA:

Welcome to the Chapel of Penha de França, founded by Antonio Dantas in 1622. The Chapel was originally built to minister to the soldiers of the small garrison at the Pontinha Redoubt (stronghold) in the bay of Funchal, but the Chapel soon became so famous a shrine that people came to it on pilgrimage from all parts of the Island. In 1721 the chapel was restored and enlarged. When the Diocese of Funchal took possession of the chapel it was used as the Bishop's Summer Residence for many years. In the meantime, the



Franciscans had been coming to Madeira to carry out apostolic duties, and in 1935, they founded the Franciscan Residence of Our Lady of Penha de França here, at the request of Bishop D. Antonio Ribeiro. In 2015 the Franciscans moved to the former convent of São Bernardino in the town of Câmara de Lobos, and the Chapel reverted back to the Diocese of Funchal. The nave roof of the Chapel has recently been repaired and the ceiling restored through the generosity of a frequent visitor to our English Mass.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(Isaiah 8:23-9:3: Psalm 26: 1 Corinthians 1:10-13.17: Matthew 4:12-23)

The first reading is from First Isaiah, when, about 725 BC, Isaiah, was advisor to the king of Judah. Ahaz, a weak king, asked Assyria for help, in spite of Isaiah's advice to wait because "God is with us". God would send a saviour, idealistically described with words probably used to hail the new king Hezekiah. Assyria attacked northern Palestine, but Isaiah looked forward to the Messiah bringing freedom to the "Way of the sea" ie Galilee.

In our second reading, in this week of prayer for Christian unity, Paul is shocked at the self-glorifying divisions, or "rents", in the church at Corinth. Whoever baptised us, we were baptised into Christ. With our common baptism we should therefore "be united in belief and practice". Unity, but not uniformity. Our task is to preach the Good News of Christ's crucifixion, without following particular teachers or allowing the meaning of the Cross to be obscured by clever oratory.

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus has rejected the devil's temptations and so identified himself as the "Son of God", capable of not sinning. Hearing of the arrest of the Baptist, Jesus withdraws to Galilee, the "Way of the sea". He then quotes the verses of Isaiah from our first reading, before starting his mission in Galilee by calling his first disciples. - Brought to you by: Chris Oliver



greatly appreciated by the person who received it! Thank You! And thank you to all who help spread the word about the poor and "People Helping People" outside our community!




CHURCH OF THE NATIVITY - Restoration in Bethlehem

The Church of the Nativity is located in Bethlehem, above what is believed to be the birthplace of Jesus. It was built by Roman Emperor Constantine in the 4th century.


The church is revered by different Christian sects and draws more than a million visitors to the Holy Land every year, making it the biggest tourist attraction in the Palestinian territories.

Since 2013, Italian experts from an art restoration firm have been working with the Palestinian government to forge ahead with an ambitious restoration of the church, which is expected to cost \$20 million when completed. **About 170 experts have been working on the restoration of the church's ceiling, wooden architraves and walls for the past 3 years.** During their research, they uncovered a mosaic angel, the 7th that still remains in the church, and cleaned and restored more than a million brilliantly coloured tiny mosaic tiles.



"For those who have faith, this is the place where God arrived on earth, born in a cave that really existed under this church," says Giammarco Piacenti, head of the project. Around two-thirds of the restoration work is finished. Funds are being sought to help restore the 50 columns and the floor mosaics and for the installation of fire prevention and lighting systems. The restoration is being funded by countries including France, Germany, Italy, Turkey and Morocco, as well as the Vatican. The project is expected to be completed in 2019.

In a short period of time we have created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants, we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from getting going hungry, their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...


