TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(Jer 20:7-9; Ps 62; Rom 12:1-2; Mt 16:21-27)

Jeremiah, probably before 600 BC, and so before the exile, criticised Israel for worshipping other gods. So Pashtur, the chief priest, beat Jeremiah and put him in the stocks. Next day, when he was released, Jeremiah told Pashtur that he would go to Babylon, where he and all his friends would die. Jeremiah then continued with this lament that God had misled him, because he had to suffer so much on the Lord's behalf, and had begun to wonder – or doubt – whether his call from God was real.

After marvelling last week at the impossibility of understanding God's plans, Paul goes on to encourage the Romans to "let your behaviour change". Like Jeremiah, they must "not be conformed to this world", but be "transformed by the renewal of your mind", discovering and doing the will of God.

In Matthew's gospel Jesus starts to instruct the disciples how he is to suffer, in accordance with God's will. Peter objects, but Jesus turns on Peter with similar words he used to Satan after his Baptism. Poor Peter! He has just been given the power to bind and loose, but now he is told he is not on God's side, but is thinking like the world! (Brought to you by: Chris Oliver) www.bible-groups.info

SAINT OF THE MONTH - September: Saint Theresa of Calcutta








Being a modern Saint, Mother Teresa is one of the better known. She was born in Macedonia, but from an early age spent much of her time abroad, firstly in Ireland and then for the remainder of her life in India.

In 1950, aged 40, she formed the Missionaries of Charity. This is a religious congregation whose sisters not only take the traditional vows of chastity, poverty and obedience, but also an additional further vow to give 'wholehearted free service to the poorest of the poor'.

The sisters work in hospices, soup kitchens, hospitals, schools and orphanages. Such has been their success, often in controversial circumstances, that in 1979 **Mother Theresa was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.** This noted her charitable work and that associated with the Pro-Life movement. Concerning the latter she remarked that if a mother can kill her own child, « all that is left is for me to kill you, and you to kill me; there is nothing in between ».





Hurricane Harvey Couldn't Stop This Kayaking Priest

Floods didn't stop Father David Bergeron, a Catholic priest, from bringing Christ and the Mass to those stranded by *Hurricane Harvey* in the United States this weekend. After spending the night in his truck, Father Bergeron got into his kayak the next morning. His mission? To return to his parish and

say Mass for Catholics stranded in the flood waters.

When ABC News spotted Father Bergeron kayaking through the streets, they stopped and interviewed him.

"I'm French-American as you can tell from my accent. I guess this is how the Americas were evangelized, in the canoe, and this is a kayak," Father Bergeron said in the interview. "I hope this can bring a smile to a few people and I'm praying for everyone who is in need." Father David Bergeron is a priest at the Catholic Charismatic Center in Houston, Texas. He's originally from Quebec. In an introduction video from the parish, Father David explained that both his first and last name means "little shepherd" – a role that he is truly fulfilling as a Catholic priest. This past weekend, he went searching for the lost (and wet) sheep!

At the end of the interview, Father Bergeron jokingly said, "There are a few Psalms that implore for the grace of God and the washing rain. But now, we have enough rain!"

People Helping People (PHP) is a small project founded in the Chapel of Penha de França to help those in need. Our Bishop D. António once said, "One must find new ways of helping the poor". A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).
