Good morning! Welcome to the Chapel of Penha de França! Today is the 4th Sunday of Lent. Father Bernardino is our English mass priest who celebrates Mass for us here at the Chapel every Sunday morning at 10am.



(2 Chron 36: 14-23; Psalm 136 (137); Eph 2: 4-10; John 3: 14-21)



Today's reading from **Chronicles** recalls Israel's exile. The Temple, central to the Jewish religion, had been defiled, followed by Israel's seventy year exile in Babylon. Then the Persian King Cyrus called for the people to return to Jerusalem and to rebuild the Temple on Mount Moriah, where Abraham almost sacrificed Isaac. After their return in 540 BC Ezra re-discovered the Jewish Law

and the people renewed their covenant with God. **The psalm** then recalls how the Israelites refused to sing for their captors while in mourning for Mount Zion. Paul's letter to the **Ephesians** emphasises the unity of the world-wide Church, based firmly on

God's saving love, shown in Jesus Christ. We have been saved by grace, a gift from God. The phrase "in Christ Jesus" occurs frequently, reminding us of the ending of every Eucharistic Prayer. Christ will bring all things to perfection "in him" – and that includes us! "We are God's work of art". In **John's gospel**, after telling Nicodemus that he must be "born again", Jesus tells him "God sent his Son into the world" so that "the world might be saved" through him. Jesus' coming provokes judgement, both now and in the future. If our deeds are true we come into the light. (*Brought to you by: Chris Oliver*) www.bible-groups.info

It is not part of the Portuguese culture to express their love, and not even to say «I love you». I am not proud of this part of my culture. There are so many people who are dying to get an expression of love but unfortunately it is not part of our daily language. Many people who know how to speak English may be talking in Portuguese but if they feel like saying «I love you» they say it in English. Many people feel awkward to say «*Eu amo-te*» (that means «I love you» in Portuguese).

But, especially mothers, have a way of saying «I love you» to their babies that if you heard them saying it without seeing what is going on, you would feel the urgency to call the police.



When they are uncontrollably in love (that's what happens with most of the mothers) their expression of love is also uncontrollable and their words sometimes sound violent. I have seen many mothers holding their babies in their arms, with their cheeks or their lips touching their baby's little face and saying «crazy» words like «I will squeeze you», «I will bite you», «I will eat you». And the baby doesn't stop giggling. The baby already understands the language of love. The language of love doesn't have to make sense.

Most people who are familiar with the Bible and get their spiritual nourishment from the Bible, have their favourite verses. I don't have any doubt that one of the most favourite and quoted verses of the Bible we find in today's Gospel (4th Sunday of Lent B).

«God loved the world so much that He gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not be lost but may have eternal life» (John 3:16)

When I read this verse, I see in my imagination a God who is uncontrollably, passionately and romantically in love with each one of us. It is like saying *«I feel like squeezing you, I feel like biting you, I feel like eating you»*. I even feel like seeing God saying *«you can live without me but I can not live without you»*.

I confess that in my spiritual journey this has been the most difficult aspect of my life: to believe that God loves me without any conditions. To believe that I can use all my imagination but I will never be able



to do anything that would stop God of loving me. I am surrounded by so many conditions. I impose so many conditions in myself that it is almost impossible to believe that God is not like me.

For us Catholics, the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** or **Confession** should be part of our Lenten journey. It is in this Sacrament that we are reconciled with God, with others and with ourselves. There is nothing more comforting than at the end of our confession, receiving the absolution and hearing the words: *«Go in Peace»*.

Lord, especially during this time of Lent, help me to believe that you love me, even if I don't care. Even If I don't love you. Help me to make specific changes in my life that when I get to Easter I will be a completely different person because I will be able to come out from the tomb like you, and with you.

We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of *People Helping People* is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).
