THE CATHOLIC ENGLISH MASS IN MADEIRA:

Good morning! Welcome to the Chapel of Penha de França. The special intention of this morning's Mass will be offered for the soul of John Stephen Hinchliffe and for the intentions of the <u>Dos Ramos family</u> (Marcelino, Rita, Cristiano, Laurence, Carmelita, and Lucia). Our priest this morning is Fr. Bernardino Andrade. This 10h00 Mass is the only Catholic Mass celebrated entirely in English on the whole island of Madeira.



TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(Isaiah 53: 10-11; Ps 32(33):4-5.18-20.22; Hebrews 4: 14-16; Mark 10: 35-45)

The reading is from **Isaiah's** last "suffering servant" song, which we hear more fully on Good Friday. Israel is identified as God's innocent servant suffering to bring to completion God's plan for the salvation of all mankind. For Isaiah suffering need not be a punishment for sin. Suffering by the righteous could "redeem" the sins of others – but only if the sinners saw it as symbolising separation from their sins, like the scapegoat sent into the desert. Christians saw Jesus as the suffering servant who redeems mankind. The psalm praises the Lord's power and kindness, confident that he will rescue us from our urgent waiting. Continuing from last week, our reading from the Letter to the Hebrews calls Jesus "the Son of God" and "the supreme high priest". Since he was tempted just like us, he is merciful and we must have confidence that he can bring us to God's "throne of grace". After Jesus' third prediction of his passion in Mark's Gospel, two Apostles ask if they can share in the kingdom's rewards? They do not understand the sort of kingdom Jesus is bringing in. The Apostles will share in Jesus' suffering, and in doing so they will show themselves to be servants to all.

1 - EMBARRASSING PAGE OF THE GOSPEL

I fell deeper in love with the Bible when I discovered that the Bible was a parable of our lives. It is a parable of my life. It is like a mirror where I can see me, my Church and the world. I can see me in some good moments, like when I try to behave like Jesus. But also it is a mirror where I can see my stupidities and my

embarrassing moments. I felt very good when someone one day told me: « You speak with the accent of Jesus». But in that mirror I can see so many dark sides of me and my church.

Today's Gospel (Mark 10) is one of those embarrassing pages of the Bible. Two brothers – James and John approached Jesus and asked Him «Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory». «When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John». Hunger for power and jealousy invaded Jesus' community. They were the chosen ones. This is a real embarrassing page of the Gospel. But Jesus was so polite to them, so patient, so kind and ended his conversation like this «Anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants



to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many».

2 - LOVE IS SERVICE

A boy was consistently coming home late from school. There was no good reason for his tardiness, and no amount of discussion seemed to help. Finally, in desperation, the boy's father sat him down and said: *«The next time you come late from school you are going to be given bread and water for your supper, and nothing else. Is that perfectly clear son?»* The boy looked straight into his father's eyes and nodded. He understood perfectly. A few days later the boy came home



even later than usual. That night however, when they sat down together at the table there was only one slice of bread in his plate and a glass of water. His father's and mother's plate were full of food. The father waited for the full impact to sink in, then quietly took the boy's plate and placed it in front of himself. He took his own plate and put it in front of the boy. The boy understood what his father was doing. His father was taking upon himself the punishment that he, the boy, had brought upon himself by his delinguent behaviour. Years later the boy recalled

the incident and said: «All my life I've known what God is like by what my father did that night.» «The Son of Man came to give his life to redeem many people».

People Helping People is a small project founded in the Chapel of Penha de França to help those in need. Our Bishop D. António once said, "One must find new ways of helping the poor". A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).
