THE CATHOLIC MASS IN ENGLISH

Welcome to the Chapel of Our Lady of Penha de França, founded by Antonio Dantas in 1622. The Chapel was originally built to minister to the soldiers of the small garrison at the Pontinha Redoubt (stronghold) in the bay of Funchal, but the Chapel soon became so famous a shrine that people came to it on pilgrimage from all parts of the Island. In 1721 the chapel was restored and enlarged. When the Diocese of Funchal took possession of the chapel it was used as the Bishop's Summer Residence for many years. In the meantime, the Franciscans had been coming to Madeira to carry out apostolic duties, and in 1935, they founded the Franciscan Residence of Our Lady of Penha de França here, at the request of Bishop D. Antonio Ribeiro. In 2015 the Franciscans moved to the former convent of São Bernardino in the town of Câmara de Lobos, and the Chapel reverted back to the Diocese of Funchal. Over the years it has been necessary to carry out repair work inside the Chapel, which was made possible through the generosity of a frequent visitor to our English Mass. At the moment, repair work is again taking place on the ceiling above the altar as it was in danger of falling down. Our priest for the 10:00am mass in English on Sunday mornings is Fr. Bernardino Andrade. There are also masses celebrated in Portuguese here at the Chapel: on Saturday evenings at 6:30pm, and on Sunday mornings at 11:30am.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(Jer 17: 5-8; Psalm 1:1-4.6; 1 Cor 15:12,16-20; Luke 6: 17,20-26)

Jeremiah lived through a stormy period about 600 BC, before and during the exile. He suffered much through sieges and imprisonments. The despair he felt at the sins of his people against God's covenant may have led him to doubt. But Jeremiah never lost hope that God is merciful, and that his new covenant would save his people. In spite of temptations and disappointments, we must trust in the Lord. The psalm praises those who do not gradually accommodate themselves to secular behaviour around us, but who "delight in the law of the Lord" and so achieve true happiness. Paul had reminded the Corinthians of the centrality of the resurrection to our faith. Now he explains: without Christ's resurrection from the dead, there is no resurrection of the body for us. Therefore no bodily life after our death – this life is all we have. He compares the resurrection of the dead to sowing a seed: the body which dies "is not the body which is to be", which will be energised by the Spirit. "What is sown is perishable, what is raised is imperishable". In Luke's gospel Jesus had chosen the twelve from his disciples. Now he proclaims God's justice is coming, showing the way to real happiness.

1. «BETTER» A DUNGEON THAN AN APARTMENT.

Kazimers Symanski of Poland was a prisoner of war during World War II. There is no record of what happened to Symanski in the prison camp, but his experiences there obviously changed him. In his later years, Symanski seemed bent on reliving his prison experience.

He even turned his small apartment into a prison cell. He put bars over the windows and constructed a small cage in which he slept. He refused to allow electricity or running water in his apartment. He

seemed determined to live in the most primitive and confining conditions. Symanski died in 1993 from the effects of his living conditions.

Some of us too have been living for years in prison cells of our own making. We are bound by addictions, anxiety, low self-esteem, anger, fear, guilt, misconceptions about God. We're just lucky to make it through the day without collapsing from the weight of our chains. But we weren't made to live that way.

The new bishop of Funchal, D. Nuno Brás, who was appointed by Pope Francis, landed in Madeira on Friday afternoon. He will be officially sworn in as the new Bishop today, February 17th, at 4pm, during a Mass at the Sé Cathedral in Funchal. D. Nuno Brás is 55 years old, and is from Lourinhã, district of Lisbon. He will be the 33rd bishop of the Diocese of Funchal.

During a news conference on Friday, Bishop Nuno said that he came "to serve" and that he will "always be available to listen and act for the good of all those who inhabit these

islands (Madeira and Porto Santo), not as a foreigner but as a Madeiran."

"My first task, of course, is to know the human and Christian reality of these two islands. I have visited Madeira several times. But it is quite different to visit than to be serving full time. And for a very solid and concrete service: that of being Bishop, Successor of the Apostles, presence of Christ. I'm not a politician nor a company manager. I am a Bishop. I have the mission to evangelize, celebrate the sacraments, lead the people of God as a Good Shepherd", he said.

Bishop Nuno will celebrate his first Mass at *Igreja do Monte* (the Monte parish church) tomorrow, February 18th, at 11:30am.

SAINT OF THE MONTH: February - Saint Valentine

Saint Valentine of Rome was a bishop and martyr of the early church. Not much is known about him, except that his relics were found in the catacombs and an ancient church was dedicated to him. Tradition has it that Valentine cured the blind daughter of a Roman judge who along with his household, was later baptized. St. Valentine married couples, going against the edict of Cladius II. It was said that on the day of his execution, he gave a note to his jailer's daughter that he cured, that was signed "your Valentine". He's pictured with birds because birds start pairing in February around his feast day.
