TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(Wis 18:6-9, Ps 32(33):1-22, Heb 11:1-2,8-19, Lk 12:32-48)

The Wisdom of Solomon was the last book of the Old Testament to be written. It was written in Greek, not Hebrew, so not in the Septuagint nor therefore in the Protestant Bible. The final chapters meditate on the Exodus, contrasting the woes visited on the Egyptians at the first Passover with the gifts given by God to the Israelites. The Psalm celebrates God's faithfulness, power and wisdom, justifying our confidence in him. The 2nd readings in August from Hebrews describe faith, which gives assurance to our hopes. Abraham is the prime example of a man of faith: he obeyed God's command to go to a new land; he believed God's promise that he and Sarah would have a child in their old age; and he passed the supreme test of faith when God asked him to sacrifice his only son, Isaac. God's last minute reprieve for Isaac is seen as a return from the dead. In Luke's Gospel, following the parable we heard last week about the rich man building a bigger barn, Jesus assures us that we will be given all the resources we need to meet the Lord's demands. He then urges us to have faith and to be prepared.



LIFE AFTER DELIVERY

In a mother's womb were two babies; one asked the other: «Do you believe in life after delivery? ». The other replied «Why, of course. There has to be something after delivery. Maybe we are here to prepare ourselves for what we will be later. » ...

« Nonsense », said the first, « There is no life after delivery. What kind of life would that be? ».

The second said *«I don't know, but there will be more light than here. Maybe we will walk with our legs and eat from our mouth. Maybe we will have other senses that we can't understand now».*

The first replied - «That is absurd. Walking is impossible. And eating with our mouths? Ridiculous! The umbilical cord supplies nutrition and everything we need. But the umbilical cord is so short. Life after delivery is to be logically excluded. ».

The second insisted - «Well I think there is something, and maybe it's different from life here. Maybe we won't need this physical cord anymore. ».

The first replied: « Nonsense. And moreover, if there is life, then why has no one ever come back from there? Delivery is the end of life, and in the after-delivery there is nothing but darkness and silence and oblivion. It takes nowhere. ».

«Well, I don't know, » said the second, «but certainly we will meet Mother and she will take care of us. ».

The first replied *«Mother? You actually believe in Mother? That's laughable. If Mother exists then where is She now? ».*

The second said: «She is all around us. We are surrounded by her. We are of Her. It is in Her that we live. Without Her this world would not and could not exist. ».

«Well I don't see her, so it is only logical that she doesn't exist», said the first, to which the second replied: «Sometimes, when you're in silence and you focus and listen, you can hear Her loving voice, calling down from above. ».

Sometimes we are like the two babies in the story, and we ask: "Is there life after death?"... "Does God exist?"

I have heard that even though birds are surrounded by air, they don't see the air. Fish are surrounded by water, but the last thing they see is the water. We are so immersed in God. We are completely soaked in God like a sponge with water. We are completely

surrounded by God like babies by their mother's wombs, like birds by air and fish by water but we are so distracted by the «life» and the «needs» created by us that we take the risk of even saying and feeling that God doesn't exist unless like the second baby says «Sometimes, when you are in silence and focus and listen we can hear HIS loving voice, calling down from above».

On the 14th and 15th of August the island of Madeira celebrates the Nossa Senhora do Monte Festival (Our Lady of the Mount). It is the biggest religious festival on the island and attracts thousands of devotees. In this popular festival held in honour of the patron saint of Madeira, Monte Parish is decorated with traditional festoons of colourful flowers. Food and beverage stalls are set up in the streets where you can sample the island's traditional boiled sweets, beef skewers, regional drinks and baked goodies. Lively processions honouring Our Lady of Monte, the patron saint of Funchal, are held on 15th August every year. The church contains elegant

chandeliers, a statue of Our Lady of Monte revered since the days when the island was first settled, beautiful pieces of gold and silverwork crafted in the 17th and 18th centuries and

In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jessus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).
