A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming ...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew



# **TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS**

Rev. 7:2-4, 9-14; Ps. 23(24):1-6; 1 John. 3:1-3; Matt 5:1-12 (Brought to you by: Chris Oliver.)

Films about "apocalypses" can lead us to misunderstand the book of Revelation. "Apocalypse" really means "revealing". Cosmic battles are raging all about us: evil seems to triumph in our world, yet this revelation of Christ gives us confidence (hope) that He will save us. The previous chapter ended by describing the coming terrible day of judgement (Dies jrae). But in this chapter, there is a pause while the elect - the chosen ones - are sealed with God's mark to show they will be protected. Not only many from Israel but numberless people from all nations. Our liturgies on earth have an effect in heaven. The chapter ends with the hope faith gives those who repent: "The Lamb ... will lead them to springs of life-giving water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes". This liturgical Psalm gives the moral requirements for assisting at divine worship, while confirming the hope the just may have in God. The reading from John's first letter emphasises that we are already God's children, but we must try to prepare for the greater joy still to come. In Matthew's Gospel the beatitudes bring the Commandments up to date: positive actions, not just avoiding doing wrong, are necessary for us to be counted among the elect.

#### **PSALM RESPONSE:** Such are the men who seek your face, O Lord.

# FROM MY HEART TO YOUR HEART

#### AN OLD TYPEWRITER, A GARAGE AND UNCLE ABRAHAM

Abraham was a child when he emigrated, with his parents, from Mexico to America. It was very common to see babies coming illegally, crossing the frontiers, taking all the risks of their parents until they arrived to the «promised land».

At that time there was a big movement led by Cesar Chavez to defend the rights of the Farmworkers. I participated in many of their demonstrations

following the philosophy of «Active Nonviolence». People could be hurt but they could not hurt anybody. «Active Nonviolence» was the philosophy of Martin Luther King, Mahatma Gandhi, Bishop Helder Camera and so many activists in Latin America.

Mr. Abraham was very involved with the poor and the oppressed. I visited his «office» many times. His office was a garage, a table and an old typewriter.

One of his greatest accomplishments was to promote complexes of houses for the low income families. He also had a state license to perform civil weddings in his garage.

One of his most faithful helpers was a good Indian friend from the Mountains of Mexico. Abraham and Joel made an excellent team.

One day I got a telephone call from the Hospital. When I arrived, his family was in the waiting room. I anointed Uncle Abraham, prayed for a few moments and returned to the waiting room to be with his family. A few moments later a Doctor entered to the waiting room and gave the news nobody wanted to hear. Mr. Abraham had just died.

The Funeral was the biggest Funeral I have ever conducted in my entire life. All the city was there to pray and to say good by to Uncle Abraham.

After his burial, I was still in the cemetery, when this man came to me with a piece of paper where a plan was already designed to build a statue to honor Uncle Abraham.

I confess that I was happy to see that plan. When I met Joel I was very excited to tell him: «Joel! Do you want to know something very special? There is a group that already has a plan to build a statue in the middle of the city dedicated to Uncle Abraham.» Well! I thought that he was going to feel excited and even maybe jump with joy in support of that project. But it didn't happen the way I expected. He became a little somber and a little sad. That's when I asked. «What's wrong Joel»? That's when he confided to me:

«Well! What Uncle Abraham most needed and desired in this moment was not a statue. What he most needed and most desired in this moment was somebody to continue his work».

Today, the 1st of November, the Church celebrates All Saints Day. In Portugal, especially in Madeira people are good in celebrating the feast of the Saints. The month of June is even known in Portugal as «Month of the popular Saints» (they are St. Anthony, St. John and St. Peter). There are lots of festivities around these three Saints. But in my heart I always think about Uncle Abraham and Joel. I feel like telling the world: What these Saints most need is not fireworks, popular dances and parades, beautiful and monumental decorations. What the Saints most need and want is somebody to continue their work.
