People Helping People is a small project founded in the Chapel of Penha de França to help those in need. Our former Bishop D. António once said, "One must find new ways of helping the poor". A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cutoff, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).



TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

Jeremiah warned Israel against their idolatry and failure to respond to God's love, breaking God's covenant. At the time of the exile to

Babylon Jeremiah proclaimed this great oracle of the "New Covenant", promising that God's Law will be written on men's hearts, giving them for ever the power – or "grace" – to respond with love to God's love. This most famous penitential Psalm echoes David's humble admission of his sin with Bathsheba: every sin is an offence against God. The Letter to the Hebrews emphasises that Jesus is truly human: He shared our humanity and our weaknesses and afflictions. So he sympathises patiently with us in our sinfulness and is well able, as a high priest, to intercede with God for us, and to offer sacrifice on our behalf. He prayed with s uch love and respect that God heard his prayer. In the gospel of John some pagan Greeks ask their fellow Greek, Philip, to help them meet Jesus. The gospel message is now reaching out to Gentiles and this is taken by Jesus as the signal that his work is nearing its inevitable climax. Jesus' life has shown the way to salvation, but the human Jesus is very troubled by anticipation of his coming suffering, also described by the other Gospels in the Garden of Gethsemene.

IT IS EASY, JUST ADD WATER

Years ago, when General Mills, Inc. first began selling Betty Crocker cake mixes, the company offered a product which only needed water. All you had to do was to add water to the mix which came in the box, and you would get a perfect, delicious cake every time. It bombed. No one bought it and the company couldn't understand why, so they



commissioned a study which brought back a surprising answer. It seemed that people weren't buying the cake mix because it was too easy. They didn't want to be totally excluded from the work of preparing a cake. They wanted to feel that

they were contributing something to it. So General Mills changed the Betty Crocker formula and required the customer to add an egg in addition to water. Immediately, the new cake mix was a huge success.

Unfortunately many of us make the same mistake when it comes to «packaging» or presenting the Christian religion. They try to make the call of Jesus Christ as easy as possible because they are afraid that, if it seems too hard, people won't «buy» it. You hear this fear operating all the time in popular religion, from well-known Gospel songs and bestselling books to earnest evangelists standing on your doorstep. All you have to do is tell Jesus you love Him. All you have to do is accept Him as your Lord and Savior. All you have to do is pray to St. Jude and put an ad in the newspaper classifieds. All you have to do is to ask for what you want in the Name of Jesus and that it will be done for you.» Whenever you hear someone saying «All you have to do is ...» in relation to Christian Faith, all you have to do is to walk away as fast as you can! You don't buy a religion where you don't even have to break an egg, where it's all premixed in the box. That kind of Faith has an immediate appeal, but it lacks the depth to sustain you over the long haul of Christian living. Jesus did not «package» Himself in this way. Jesus said a number of things ab out the blessings of Faith, and He talked about asking in order to receive, but he never presented the overall Christian life as being particularly easy.



We still have the time to plan our prayer life, to evaluate and renew relationships; we still have the time to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation with Confession where God in his unlimited mercy will embrace us and say: SHALLOM. GO AND LIVE IN PEACE.


