People Helping People is a small project founded in the Chapel of Penha de França to help those in need. Our former Bishop D. António once said, "One must find new ways of helping the poor". A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 25).



CATHOLIC MASS IN ENGLISH MADEIRA:

Good morning! Welcome to the Chapel of Our Lady of Penha de França.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(Deut 4: 1-2, 6-8; Psalm 14(15): 2-5; James 1: 1-27; Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23)

After the testamentary speech from Joshua last week, this week we have the beginning of Moses' last testament, following God's refusal to allow Moses to cross the Jordan and enter the Promised Land. In **Deuteronomy** Moses sums up the Law, but with some relaxations





from the strict Law given by God on Sinai. As God's representative, Moses allowed divorce and hating enemies. But God's justice cannot change, and Jesus will later reverse these changes, made "because of their hardness of heart". Observing God's Law "will demonstrate to the peoples" their wisdom and understanding.

The Psalm summarises the moral qualities required to be "at one" with the Lord, especially the social virtues of justice and charity. James also insists "do what the word tells you", especially helping the vulnerable and avoiding contamination by the world. We must be "quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger". More practical advice from James in the coming weeks. Jesus gives the same message: his disciples should do what the Pharisees say, but not what they do. As Peter is to learn later before preaching to Cornelius, "nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean". It is what we do that can make us unclean, not lack of washing. This teaching is underlined immediately by the faith of the Syro-Phoenician woman.

<u>PSALM RESPONSE</u>: The just will live in the presence of the Lord.

JESUS. A LAW BREAKER

One day I was saying a weekday Mass with a small group of people in my Parish Church when I asked them: «Is there in the world anything more important than the law of God»? The answer was what I expected: «No!». They were shocked when I said: «Yes! There's something in the world more important than the law of God. More important than the law of God is the God of the law».

In this time of Covid 19 when all scientists and authorities insist on the importance of constantly washing hands, many people would find strange that Jesus criticizes the Pharisees who, on their part, criticize Jesus' disciples for eating without washing their hands. There is no doubt that Jesus was not against hygiene. Jesus was against the cruel laws that had been imposed by the Pharisees and Jewish authorities, oppressing people. Jesus was not just against those laws but He broke them constantly. Jesus didn't love religion. Jesus didn't love laws. Jesus loved people.

There was a law that put lepers apart from the community. By law they should be isolated from other people. A leper was an unclean person. If he had to pass through a street he had to ring a bell and cry out loud «unclean, unclean» and everybody should run away. If any person touched him he would become unclean. One day a leper begged Jesus to heal him. I know that it would have been so easy for Jesus to heal him with a mere thought or a word. But according to the Gospel of Mark 1:40 «Jesus was filled with pity and reached out and touched him» and the leper was healed. Yes. The leper was healed but Jesus became unclean like the leper. For Jesus, the «God of the law» was more important than what the Pharisees considered the «law of God».

This Pharisaism is still among us today.

"People Helping People" accompanied a single mother during her time of pregnancy. One day we took her to a state institution asking for help. The lady responsible for helping her was upset because according to her she had recommended abortion and the girl had refused. The baby was born. Another state institution helped this baby especially with nappies and milk. One day this mother went to my office and said: «I am coming from that institution. They just told me that they wouldn't give my baby any more milk or nappies because he is already one year old. I thought it was a misunderstanding and went there to be sure. The answer was that she was right. Then I asked: «Isn't there another alternative?» The answer was a cold «no». Laws are laws. The rest is insignificant. This is Pharisaism.

The President of People Helping People invited me to visit a family in the country side who were in terrible need. It was a rainy and windy afternoon of November. After a long search we finally found the house. What we saw was a scene not to forget. The mother was just looking at the ceiling not understanding what was going on. The Son, a handsome 30-year-old man, after an aggressive cancer, was seated at the table but he was not involved in the conversation. He had already forgotten how to write his name. The only person who was functioning well was a young daughter who was a mother of two beautiful girls who had recently been abandoned by her husband. Lying on the table were medical prescriptions for their mental problems. This was November. The prescriptions had been written in August. But there was no money to buy the medications. This was Sunday night. On Monday we went to a state institution looking for help. There was no help because this family didn't qualify. After some discussion the lady there told us: «Laws are made to be obeyed». My last answer was: «The soldiers of Hitler used to say the same thing».



It was this kind of pharisaic law that made Jesus outraged against the Pharisees, who found so important the Jewish laws but ignoring completely the human needs. Actually Jesus summarized all those complicated laws in ONE. Just one: LOVE ONE ANOTHER AS I HAVE LOVED YOU. (JO. 13: 34)
