In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

CATHOLIC MASS IN ENGLISH MADEIRA:

Good morning! Welcome to the Chapel of Our Lady of Penha de Franca. This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Penha de Franca.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(Isaiah 50: 5-9; Psalm 114(115); James 2: 14-18; Mark 8: 27-35)

Second Isaiah was writing during the exile in Babylon. Israel had lost land, king, and Temple. But Isaiah confidently proclaims hope of returning to Jerusalem: have no fear, whatever ills beset us, God is on our side and will save us. The Psalm offers an individual's grateful praise to the Lord: in danger of death he trusted in the Lord who saved him. James' letter develops last week's theme of what faith is: real faith cannot help but be expressed in good works. James insists that you cannot show you have faith without showing the good works it produces. He then gives examples: Abraham, who offered Isaac; and Rahab the prostitute, who protected Joshua's spies in Jericho. Both were justified by their works of faith. This message challenges us today: is giving money enough? For the first time in Mark's Gospel a human being acknowledges Jesus as the Christ. But then Peter immediately gets it wrong and is severely chastised by Jesus; God's ways are not our ways. Jesus has to suffer the humiliation Isaiah described to show the way we must follow to salvation. The way of the Cross is the only way, and we must imitate Jesus' faith in his Father and follow his way in faith.

PSALM RESPONSE: I will walk in the presence of the Lord in the land of the living.


- "How was the trip?"

POPE FRANCIS SENDS 15,000 ICECREAMS – To prisoners in Italy

Pope Francis wanted to help Italy's prisoners cool down as temperatures soared to record levels this summer - so he sent them 15.000 ice creams!

Inmates at the Regina Coeli jail and Rebibbia prison in Rome were blessed with the frozen goods, an act the Vatican described as one of several "small evangelical gestures" made "to help and give hope to thousands" imprisoned in the capital.

The ice creams were delivered in Pope Francis's name by Cardinal Konrad Krajewski, who is known as the "papal almoner." The role, to which Krajewski was appointed in 2013, requires him to carry out charitable acts on behalf of the pope and the Vatican's charities.
