People Helping People is a small project founded in the Chapel of Penha de França to help those in need. Our former Bishop D. António once said, "One must find new ways of helping the poor". A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

CATHOLIC MASS IN ENGLISH MADEIRA:

Good morning! Welcome to the Chapel of Our Lady of Penha de França. We are blessed to have Fr. Bernardino presiding our Sunday Mass in English every week.

A little bit of history about our Chapel:

The Chapel, founded almost 400 years ago by Antonio Dantas, was originally built to minister to the soldiers of the small garrison at the Pontinha Redoubt (stronghold) in the bay of Funchal in 1622. The Chapel soon became so famous a shrine that people came to it on pilgrimage from all parts of the Island. In 1721 the chapel was restored and enlarged. When the Diocese of Funchal

took possession of the chapel it was used as the Bishop's Summer Residence for many years. In the meantime, the Franciscans had been coming to Madeira to carry out apostolic duties, and in 1935, they founded the Franciscan Residence of Our Lady of Penha de França here, at the request of Bishop D. Antonio Ribeiro. In 2015 the Franciscans moved to the former convent of São Bernardino in the town of Câmara de Lobos, and the Chapel reverted back to the Diocese of Funchal. A few years ago, the nave roof of the Chapel was repaired and the ceiling restored through the generosity of the late Sir Ronald McIntosh as well as other frequent visitors to our English Mass.



TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(Jeremiah 31: 7-9; Psalm 125(126); Hebrews 5: 1-6; Mark 10: 46-52)

Jeremiah has promised that Israel will return from their exile in Babylon. This new exodus will be on a smooth path with ample water, not like the first wanderings in the desert. God has redeemed his people, and will make a new unbreakable covenant with Israel, writing his law on people's hearts, instead of on breakable stone. Jesus made this new covenant at the Last Supper.

The Psalm exults in the imagined joy of this restoration, so intense as to seem like dream.

The extended extract from **Hebrews** read over the last 2 weeks, concludes by showing how Christ's humanity enables him to understand our weaknesses. As the high priest forever, appointed by God at his baptism, Christ is therefore supremely fitted to mediate between us and God. But Hebrews goes on to say that Christ had to learn the depths of the human condition through his suffering. Today we hear the last of Jesus' teachings during his journey up to Jerusalem. He can see who Jesus is more clearly than the disciples following Jesus. He then calls Jesus "Master", the only person in the first three gospels to do so before the resurrection. Able to see, Bartimeus now follows as a disciple.

PSALM RESPONSE: What Marvels the Lord worked for us! Indeed we were glad.

LOVE IS BLIND!... OR IS IT?

He lives in Madeira Island. His life was being destroyed daily by the use and traffic of drugs. His family, especially his mother, lived in a permanent nightmare. She tried everything to make that «adorable son» to be clean and recover from, what she described, as a daily tragedy. She begged, she cried, she tried to negotiate, she even tried to bribe him, but nothing worked. Besides, being a drug dealer, she knew that sooner or later her «adorable son» was going to end

up in a court room and finally in jail. And then, maybe after years of confinement, after getting out of prison she knew that what always happens to ex-prisoners was going to happen to him. After leaving prison, they find all the doors closed... except one. The only door that ex-prisoners find open for them is the door of the prison. All these scenes were passing through her mind and piercing her heart like a horror movie.



Finally, one day she made a «crazy» decision. It was one of those decisions that only lovers can make. It reminded me of a statement from a priest who gave us a priest's retreat many years ago in California. I am afraid I forgot almost everything of what he said but I never forgot one of his statements: «Lovers always look insane for the non-lovers». This mother's decision really looked insane. One day she approached her son and said: «My son, you know how much I love you. Maybe I have been selfish insisting with you to change. I want to tell you that my love for you has no conditions. Yes. I want to tell you that you don't have to stop taking drugs. You don't have to stop distributing drugs. My love is unconditional. You don't have to change. I have made a decision. From now on I will be with you wherever vou are and help vou to distribute drugs. Just tell me where and when. But I also know that the world of drugs is a very dangerous world. If they kill you, I want to die with you. If you are arrested and go to jail, I want to go to prison with you. Even if I have to be in a different jail, I want you to know that I am close to you, eating the same food, and sleeping in the same kind of bed, suffering the same kind of insults and abuses, and wearing the same kind and colour of uniform. No, my son... you don't have to change. I love you the way you are. You don't have to change».

Her son was horrified. His mother looked calm; she was sure that she had made the right decision. She was beautiful and always had a beautiful smile. That's the way their conversation ended, but she was not able to stop two stubborn tears running down her face.



Before they went to bed she approached him and asked: «When do you want to start? Where do you have that material? Where to go? How to do it? Always remember that God loves you and so do I with an unconditional love». The following day, very early in the morning, he gave his mother a bag, gave her some instructions, and told her where to go and to whom she was supposed to deliver that illegal and dangerous material. And she did. But it didn't take too long for him to run to his mother, hug her, ask her forgiveness and promise to start a new life. And he did.

Is love blind? I don't think so. Hatred is blind. What blinds us is not love. What blinds us are our grudges, our indifferences, our hatred, our jealousy, our judgments, our gossip and so on. On the contrary, Love opens our eyes and makes us see beauty, hope and many wonderful things in people that can only be seen by lovers. Can be seen by God only.

Today's Gospel (30th Sunday-B) talks about a blind man who asked Jesus for a miracle. «Lord make me see again». In this world of pessimism and darkness I will add to my daily prayer: «Lord make me see again». And I am sure that in that person who is called a criminal, a poor or a homeless man, Jesus is going to help me to see a saint. I am sure I will start seeing Jesus Himself even in the lowest drug addict because I will start believing that love makes me see with the eyes of God.
