People Helping People is a small project founded in the Chapel of Penha de França to help those in need. Our former Bishop D. António once said, "One must find new ways of helping the poor". A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way. different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

#### CATHOLIC MASS IN ENGLISH IN MADEIRA

Good morning! Father Bernardino Andrade is our appointed Sunday priest for this 10am mass in English. This is the only Catholic Mass in English on the whole Island of Madeira. Father Bernardino was born in Madeira but lived and preached for many years in America, and also in Mozambique.



### **TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS**

(Acts 15:1-2, 22-29; Psalm 66(67); Rev 21:10-14, 22-23; John 14:23-29)

In Acts, after the success of the first mission of Paul and Barnabas in setting up Gentile churches, Jewish Christian visitors from Jerusalem came to Antioch saying Gentiles must be circumcised to be saved. So Barnabas and Paul went up to Jerusalem for what is called the First Council of the church. The issue appears simple, but underneath were two other issues; whether Christianity could remain within Judaism: and whether Paul's new Gentile Christian communities could remain in communion with the rest of the church. The Holv Spirit leads the discussion to a decision. The Psalm calls on all peoples to praise the Lord because he governs wisely and makes the earth give food. From Revelation we have part of John's vision of the new Jerusalem, the church, founded on the apostles. Here Christ dwells among men, so no Temple needed. In John's gospel, Jesus' Last Supper discourse shows his joy that he will soon return to his Father. He promises to send "another" Advocate who will make Jesus present in his church for the rest of time. The name "advocate" captures the several roles the Holy Spirit plays in the church and for us. He both consoles and advises or counsels us, while also representing us to God in the heavenly court.

#### **REASONS TO GET UP IN THE MORNING**

**Today (17/05/2022) I had to take a taxi.** The taxi driver, very politely, left his seat, opened the back door of his car and invited me to enter. I declined the back seat by asking him if I could ride in the front seat. Of course, he said yes and allowed me to take the seat at his right side. We started talking. I asked for his name, where he lived, and if

he had a family (and usually taxi drivers like to talk, and I like to listen to them). **Talking about his family**, he mentioned that he was very happy, had a wonderful wife, a seventeen and an eleven-year-old daughter. When he got to this point, he opened his heart saying that they were the reasons for him to get up in the morning. I don't think that there could be anything more depressing for any person than going to bed at night without knowing why they got up that morning.

When he dropped me off, I started reflecting about some of my main reasons why I get up every morning. And then I realized that these were the main *loves* or *pillars* of my life. And what happens is that these *loves of my life* inundate the 24 hours of my day. They are:

#### THE GOOD SHEPHERD INSPIRES ME. GUIDES AND CHALLENGES ME

The Good Shepherd leaves the ninety-nine sheep that are protected in the sheepfold, and walks and runs through dangerous roads and dangerous paths and dangerous rocks looking for the **one** who is lost. Sometimes I am afraid that the Church does completely the opposite: which is leaving the ninety-nine that are lost and spending all her time and energy protecting and taking care of the one that's safe in the sheep fold. This is maybe the first reason for me to get up in the morning. Two weeks ago we celebrated the Feast of the Good Shepherd in the Cantinho do Bom Pastor (Little Corner of the Good Shepherd), in Bica da Cana. The Mass presided by our Bishop Nuno, was especially dedicated to the people in the Front Line, who, very often worked beyond their strengths to help people overcome this pandemic. It was a Mass of Thanksgiving.

# 2. PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE PUSHES ME

The Association People Helping People always takes me from my comfort zone and forces me to put all my energies, my car and my money to serve the needy. We get lots of help but never enough to answer to the dramatic needs of our poor. Today I received this SMS: "Dear Father: Since last Monday Mr. Alexandre has been trying to help me but he was not able to do it. I know that you are not getting enough income to help those who need help. But I have to take two kinds of medication for my depression that would help me to breathe and not to feel dizzy and lose my balance. Tomorrow I have to do a thyroid biopsy. I don't know what to do. I am tired. Life doesn't have any meaning for me. I feel very lonely. A few days ago I talked for long time with Mr. Alexandre. He is a very human and generous person. He comforted my soul. I like him very much. Thank you, Father, for everything". Somebody had to take money from his own pocket to answer to this human drama of a mother who had to take her 15-year-old daughter to the hospital for trying to commit suicide. This is another reason for me to get up in the morning.

#### 3. ENGLSH MASS ATTRACTS ME AND SUPPORTS ME

The English Mass is another reason to get excited and jump from my bed every morning, especially every Sunday. That's where I celebrate the Lord's Supper with my special friends and, before the Mass ends, I always hear a «special appeal» done by special people that brings hope and smiles

to many needy people. A poignant question that always challenges me and makes me get up in the morning is: «If I don't do it, who is going to do it»? Love & Peace

Bishop Nuno, the Catholic Bishop of the Diocese of Funchal, and Bishop David, the Anglican Suffragan Bishop of the Diocese of Europe jointly led the worship. This Mass brought together Catholics and Anglicans, in the light of



the "Malines Conversations" an ecumenical journey which in 2021 celebrated its centenary.

(The **Malines Conversations** were a series of five informal ecumenical conversations held from 1921 to 1927 which explored possibilities for the corporate reunion


between the Roman Catholic Church and the Church of England, forming one stage of Anglican–Roman Catholic dialogue).

Tomorrow, on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> of May at 4:30pm the Sé Cathedral in Funchal will receive the symbols of the World Youth Day. Also on this day during the 5:30pm mass at the Cathedral, the relics of Blessed Carlo Acutis will be presented. Carlo was a young Italian who died at only 15 years old, offering his suffering for the pope and the Church. The relic was an offer from the holder of the Cause.





Francis of Assisi, Italy, on October 10, 2020, in the presence of his parents, Andrea and Antonia, and his two brothers. Carlo Acutis is considered the first '*influencer*' on religious issues, and known as the 'patron of the internet'. Carlo's life was totally dedicated to Christ. "*To be always united with Jesus, this is my life project*", Carlo Acutis wrote at the age of 7.
