We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

ASCENSION OF JESUS, A JOB'S CONTINUATION

TWELVE-YEAR-OLD GIRL. A THEOLOGIAN IN TRAINING

For nine years I taught Religion in a High School in Quelimane (Mozambigue). One day I assigned a group project to my students. Quelimane was a small and beautiful African city where everybody knew everybody. I asked my students to go around and ask people this question: "What do you live for"?

And they did. They went around, stopped cars, interrupted people having coffee or having meals in coffee shops, with paper and pen in their hands, and explained that they were doing a school project and they would like to ask this question. And the question was: «What do you live for?». The answers were very interesting.

Some people just said: «For nothing». But when they realized that the students were serious and were writing their answers they stopped for a while and tried to say something. The majority




of the people answered saving that they had never thought about that.

When the students brought me the results of their research, it was their turn: I asked them: «What do you live for?». This happened around 55 years ago. But even after this long time I never forgot the answer of a 12-year-old girl: «I live to continue the work of God». I thought I knew the answer but I realized that I didn't know how to verbalize it so well. God had a project for the world and for each one of us. According to her, and I agree, our purpose in life is to continue the work of God.

Jesus instructs us in His Ascension message to finish His work of saving mankind by proclaiming His Good News by words and deeds. Jesus brought to the world an enormous project. The project of Jesus was to build the Kingdom of His Father. The Father didn't send Jesus to the world to build the Catholic Church. The Catholic Church is just an instrument to build the Kingdom of God.

But He didn't finish His job. Now, like my student in Africa it's up to us to continue His job.

Ascension of the Lord

ASCENSION: the act of rising to a higher level

The Ascension of the Lord takes place forty days after the resurrection of Jesus (Easter).

Technically, this day falls on a Thursday, but the celebration is transferred to the following Sunday.

On this day, Jesus was taken up to Heaven in his resurrected body in the presence of his apostles.

 As the apostles were watching. Jesus was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." Acts 1:9-11

The ascension is also professed in the Nicene Creed and in the Apostles' Creed: "He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father...

Jesus departs, he ascends to Heaven. He returns to the Father. But this does not mean a separation, for he remains forever with us, in a new way. By his ascension, the Risen Lord draws the gaze of the Apostles - and our gaze - to the heights of Heaven to show us that the end of our journey is the Father... Yet, Jesus remains present and active in the affairs of human history through the power and the gifts of his Spirit; he is beside each of us: even if we do not see him with our eyes. He is there! He accompanies us. he guides us, he takes us by the hand and he lifts us up when we fall down.... The Lord is with us!
