TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(Acts 2: 1-11; Psalm 103(104); Romans 8: 8-17; John 14: 15-16, 23-26)

The Jewish feast of Pentecost, 50 days after Passover, was less well known

than the other two pilgrimage feasts. Passover was linked to the nomadic sacrifice of lambs and the barley harvest in the Spring. Tabernacles after the grape harvest was associated with the wanderings in the desert. Recently it was realised that Pentecost was associated with God giving the Covenant on Sinai. So the coming of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles at Pentecost fits neatly with this Covenant feast: the formal birth of the Christian Church. Acts lists the regions where the Church was to grow. The Psalm calls us to praise God's creative wisdom. Filled with wonder at the details of God's glorious works, this psalm is well worth reading in full. Paul urges the Romans to live by the Spirit who, with Christ, has made his home in us. We are now Sons of God. If we are led by the Spirit within us to follow God's laws, we will have confidence that the Father will "give life to our mortal bodies", just as Jesus was raised. In John's Gospel we hear from Jesus' long Last Supper talk, promising that his Father would send the Advocate, through whom he and the Father would be with his church for all



Once, a mother took her five-year-old son with her to a concert by *Ignacy Paderewski*, the great Polish pianist. The mother and her son got their seats close to the stage. Then the mother met her old friend and got involved talking with her. She failed to notice that her son had slipped away to do some exploring.

At the right time the lights dimmed and the spotlight came on. Only then did the mother see her five-year-old son on the stage, sitting on the piano bench, innocently picking out

"Twinkle, Twinkle, Little star."

Before she could retrieve her son, Paderewski walked on to the stage. Walking over to the piano, he

whispered to the boy, "Don't stop! Keep playing."

Then, leaning over the boy, Paderewski reached out his left hand and began to fill in the bass. Later, he reached around the other side of the boy and added a running obbligato.

Together, the great maestro and the tiny five-year-old mesmerized the audience with their playing.

FOUR HUNDRED YEARS OF FAITH - Chapel of Penha de França

Did you know that people have been praying in this Chapel for 400 years? It's true!

This year marks the 400th anniversary of the Chapel. It was founded by António Dantas in 1622, and soon became a famous a shrine, with people coming to it on pilgrimage from all parts of the Island. In 1721 the chapel was restored and enlarged. When the Diocese of Funchal took possession of the chapel it was used for the bishops as a Country House or Summer Residence for many years. The English Mass is a tradition that dates back to 1966, when Fr. Rafael Andrade, having just returned from his first visit to England, complied to the Bishop's request to start an English celebration. It was first held in the Church of Santa Clara but a few





Photo of the Chapel from the 1800s, showing the peak on which it was built. Photo credit: from the Facebook page: *Madeira Quase Esquecida*

months later it changed to Penha de França. It was closer to Funchal and of easier access to the visitors. Fr Rafael presided this mass for over 20 years, until in 2007 when Fr. Bernardino took over the celebration, and still does it today.


