People Helping People is a small project founded in the Chapel of Penha de França to help those in need. Our former Bishop D. António once said, "One must find new ways of helping the poor". A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(Habbakuk 1:2-3,2:2-4; Psalm 94(95); 2 Timothy 1:6-8,13-14; Luke 17:5-10)

Habbakuk appears to have prophesied while Judah was being threatened by Babylon, who destroyed Jerusalem in 586 BC. Habbakuk expresses the ever-present frustration of mankind that evil people always seem to triumph. Since God is good and just, why doesn't He intervene to help those who worship Him? Instead of punishing his erring people by a nation even more wicked? God's answer here is that "the upright man will live by his faithfulness". So Habbakuk agrees to "quietly wait" for the invaders to be punished. **The Psalm** invites us to praise and worship the Lord daily, for he is our king and shepherd. We must not lose faith in God, as did the Israelites in their desert journey.

In the first of four readings from Paul's second letter to **Timothy**, he is urged to "bear the hardships" relying on God's power, using and developing his skills to testify to the good news. You should "guard the rich truth that has been entrusted to you" the truth that Jesus, "has abolished death".

In **Luke's Gospel** Jesus continues to teach on his way to Jerusalem. We must have confidence in God's plan, carrying out the tasks God has given us. We must not expect God to put this world to rights in our lifetime.

PSALM RESPONSE: O that today you would listen to his voice! "Harden not your hearts."

"LOAVES AND FISHES" - A TASTE OF THE KINGDOM OF GOD

November 11, 2002 will leave a deep mark in the history of *St. Anthony's Church* in Oakley. "Loaves and Fishes" inaugurated today is a program to serve free meals to the public. Today, November 11, 2002 free meals were served between 11:30 AM and 1:15 PM in



What most fascinates me and makes me see this program as a taste of the Kingdom of God is that one of the most important policies of the program is "no questions asked". It reminds me of a similar program I visited many years ago in Half Moon Bay. The name was "No Strings Attached".

All the programs I know make a terrible effort to separate the poor from the less poor and from the rich. I think that one of the signs that the Kingdom of God is near is when all human beings will feel comfortable to sit around the same table to share their food and their stories.

It was around one of the tables at the *St. Anthony's* Hall, while drinking a cup of coffee and eating some tortillas, that I heard the story of a Parishioner who crossed the border from Mexico to the USA 63 times. The Border Police had told him that if he was caught for the 63rd time he was going to have an experience to never forget. Smiling he agreed that they were right. On the 63rd time he was caught, he faced jail, starvation and beatings. Still smiling he commented that "I was not counting the times. I had no idea how many times I had crossed the border illegally. But they knew it".



Today I saw people from different social levels, seated around the same table sharing the same food and the same friendship. I saw illiterate migrant people eating very close to a pregnant medical doctor and her husband who were enjoying the same food and the same friendship. I saw Catholics and Protestants sharing their experiences and their dreams while sharing the same food. I saw children and elderly

touching each other, laughing and talking while sharing a delicious menu of roast beef, mashed potatoes, fruit salad, juice, coffee and lots of pastries.

One thing left me speechless. The Director of *Loaves and Fishes*, Rick Richardson, approached me last Sunday and handed me a closed envelope. When I opened it there was a check of \$500 dollars for the Church. I couldn't believe it.

Today, jokingly, I asked him if he had made a mistake because I thought we were the ones who should pay them for offering such a great service to *St Anthony's* and our people. God is a good God. The Kingdom of God is near.
