People Helping People is a small project founded in the Chapel of Penha de França to help those in need. Our former Bishop D. António once said, "One must find new ways of helping the poor". A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. **We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...**

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

CATHOLIC MASS - IN ENGLISH - IN MADEIRA

Good morning! Welcome to the Chapel of Our Lady of

Penha de França. **Today is the Fourth Sunday of Advent.** The 10am Mass this morning will be celebrated by Fr. Joseph Arun. The special intentions of today's Mass are for: (1) the soul of Manuel Gomes Sebastiao who passed away 8 years ago today (2) for the soul of João Domingos Grotá, on the 1-year anniversary of his passing, and (3) for the soul of Karen Matthews who passed away two months ago on the 12th of October 2022. In your prayers this week, please also remember Fr. Bernardino who is in the hospital.



TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(Isaiah 7:10-14; Psalm 23(24); Romans 1:1-7; Matthew 1:18-24)

First **Isaiah** was writing before 700 BC, when Judah was under attack. Isaiah promises that a time of peace will come when Israel returns to living simply, with no riches to make others envious. But only if they keep their faith in God. Without being asked, God gives King Ahaz a sign of his support: a young woman will bear a son, to be named Emmanuel, "God with us". Israel will still suffer. But a remnant of David's house will survive, like the stump of a fallen tree. After praising God's universal dominion, the **Psalm** gives moral requirements for assisting at divine worship. Paul begins his letter to the Jewish Christian community in Rome very carefully. They did not know him, so he assures them that he shares their beliefs, especially that Jesus, a descendant of David, is the Christ, proclaimed Son of God through his resurrection. Before **Matthew** describes Jesus' birth, he lists 42 ancestors linking Jesus firmly with Abraham, David and Israel's kings. The list includes four women, Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, and the wife of Uriah. Through their unconventional behaviour, a remnant of David's line survived, reminding us of the important roles women have always played in God's plan.

PSALM RESPONSE: Let the Lord enter! He is the king of glory.



FROM MY HEART TO YOUR HEART



Last Sunday during Mass we prayed for Father Bernardino who is ill and in the hospital. A small book was left in the social room where people could write some "Get Well" messages for Father. The messages were given to Father that afternoon when we visited him in the hospital. He was so pleased and happy to see everyone's messages, and wishes to thank everyone who took the time to write him a little note.



We know that Father would have liked to share with you a special Christmas message, but as he is ill, we are reprinting his column from last year's newsletter:

A GOLDEN CHRISTMAS GIFT

I lived all my childhood in the countryside. Every piece of land was used for farming. I remember my father saying that when he was younger, if they found even if it was a mere piece of stone, that they would put a little bit of soil on it and would sow a little bit of wheat. The land was sacred. On this mountainous island it was not possible to have big farms. Everything that was planted had the purpose of feeding the family. Fruit trees were a luxury. But in my neighbourhood there was an orange fruit tree. The neighbours would use it a lot to ask for leaves to boil and make tea when a family member was sick. There were no supermarkets or money to buy oranges.

I used to hear stories of the Baby Jesus coming down through the chimney and bringing gifts to the children. I don't remember of the Baby Jesus bringing me any gifts but it was not a problem. It was the same for all the children of the neighbourhood, that's why we didn't have the time to be jealous. Christmas was Christmas and that was great. The aroma of home-baked bread, cakes and cookies and Church celebrations, movement of people walking through the streets to visit their families were enough. Oh... Oh... Oh... I had one Christmas gift:

I don't remember the details but I remember that one day the Baby Jesus brought me a very special Christmas gift. He brought me an orange. It was so golden, so yellow, so beautiful, so attractive that I had no courage to take the skin off and eat it. I spent the day with that orange in my hands, showing it to my friends. I felt like as if I had the world in my hands.

When I told this story in my Parish in California I was surprised when an American lady told me that in her childhood, an orange had also been the only Christmas gift she had ever received.

But the funny part of the story was when on Christmas eve, a lady called Pam Juarez came with her daughter to the Parish residence and brought me a box full of oranges. After that, and this happened for years, on every first Sunday of Advent I started finding over the altar a beautiful yellow orange, and then a box of oranges at my residence.

When I announced that I was leaving the Parish and coming back to Portugal this same lady brought me a plastic orange as yellow as the ones she used to give me in California. This plastic orange is the one that is on our altar today. This happened fifteen years ago and it is still yellow and beautiful and reminding me that happiness is not in «having but in being»

We collected enough goodies to make up 11 bags which will be distributed through our people helping people Charity to needy folk this Christmas.


