In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

CATHOLIC MASS - ENGLISH SERVICE

Good morning! Welcome to the Chapel of Our Lady of Penha de França. Our Mass today will be celebrated by Father Joseph Arun.

The special intention of this morning's mass will be for the soul of myung -ja chung (Helena) who passed away 1 year ago.



(Zeph 2:3,3:12-13; Psalm 145(146): 7-10; 1 Corinthians 1:26-31; Matthew 5:1-12)

About 630 BC, **Zephaniah** strongly denounced the idolatry that had developed during the reign of Josiah. He prophesied "A day of wrath, ... a day of darkness and gloom" - from which we have our hymn *Dies Irae*. But God would leave a remnant of humble and lowly people - from whom tradition believes Jesus' and John the Baptist's parents came, and also Simeon and Anna. **The Psalm**, echoed by Mary in Luke's Magnificat, confirms that God's justice will prevail: the hungry will be fed, the blind given sight, but the wicked will lose out. Continuing his letter to the **Corinthians**, Paul reminds them "the world did not know God through wisdom". God has made us members of Christ, who has become our wisdom. God's plan works in ways that seem foolish and weak to us. We have nothing to boast about except the Lord. About forty years after Jesus died, **Matthew** followed Mark in writing a gospel, which he arranged as five collections of sayings by Jesus, alternating with five collections describing what Jesus did. The first collection of sayings, the Sermon on the Mount, starts with the Beatitudes, which we hear today. Over the remaining Sundays before Lent we hear the rest of this Sermon, in which Jesus develops the Commandments given to Moses into positive ways of living. Although much of the promised happiness of the kingdom of God is in the future, it does extend to the present time in anticipation.

PSALM RESPONSE: How happy are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

WHEN BEING POOR IS GOOD NEWS

Most of the countries in the world celebrate their «Declaration Day of Independence». The Beatitudes are a «Declaration Day of our Dependence of God».

As Father Kadavil says, the Beatitudes are a «series of bombshells» or «flashes of lightning followed by thunder of surprise and shock» because Jesus reverses our «natural» assumption that happiness lies

in riches, power, pleasure and comfort. We believe in personal pride; Jesus blesses poverty of spirit. We seek pleasure; Jesus blesses those who mourn. We see the prosperity of aggressive people; Jesus blesses the meek. We love good food and drink; Jesus blesses those who hunger and thirst for righteousness. He challenges his listeners to find fulfillment of their needs in God, in their particular socio-economic context.

The peasants, the farm workers, and the artisans of the villages in Palestine were the oppressed class.

The majority of them had no political power or rights. In contrast to them were the rich and powerful, who owned most of the land, collaborated with the hated Romans, controlled the Temple cult, and interpreted the laws of God. Jesus addresses this situation in his Beatitudes.
