In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way. different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).



TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(Isaiah 50:4-7; Psalm 21(22); Philippians 2:6-11; Matthew 26:14 – 27:66)

In exile in Babylon, after Jerusalem was destroyed in 597 BC, the despairing people are tempted to give up their faith in God. In the 'servant-song' Isaiah offers consolation, recommending trust in the Lord. Today Isaiah's words express both our horror at the way Our Lord was treated, and our admiration for his example of patient non-retaliation. Trusting confidently in his Father, he "sets his face like flint", even though it is covered with spittle. On the Cross, Jesus uttered the first words of this Psalm which reflects his suffering. Not a cry of despair, but expressing Jesus' complete confidence in his Father and praising the redemption bought by his Cross. The hymn in Philippians rejoices: unlike Adam, Jesus did not seek to be equal to God. But God raised him to glory and gave him the name 'Lord'. Jesus on the Cross invites us to imitate his humility. Matthew's Passion, with its lively dialogue, shows Jesus aware and in control. Writing after the destruction of Jerusalem in AD 70, Matthew blamed the Jewish leaders for Jesus' death. Jesus died just before Passover, when Jews celebrated their freedom from slavery. Soldiers, Jewish leaders, the inscription on the Cross, all ironically give Jesus his true title of 'King of the Jews', the Messiah. Jesus' obedience to God's plan gives the Cross meaning.

IF YOU WANT TO BECOME A NOBODY, JOIN US

I felt the need to have a private retreat. Usually when I make retreats I do it with a group, and one retreat Director giving conferences about spiritual themes to help us to reflect about God and about ourselves.

This time I chose to go to a retreat house that belonged to a community of nuns and make the retreat by myself.

When I arrived there, I saw a man dressed in overalls, painting the house. He had paint all over him. He had paint on his hands, his clothes, his face,

and in his hair. Finally at lunch time I was invited to a dining room to have a meal with him. It didn't take too long to discover that he was a priest. Having meals together, he inspired me a lot to have a good retreat. That's when he told me about the *«becoming a nobody»*.

In America it is common to make advertisements in newspapers, inviting young boys and girls to enter the convents and seminaries, giving them attractive reasons to become priests, nuns or brothers. To advertise vocations, they use the same methods as they use to advertise any other product. They try to show attractive pictures and also attractive reasons to enter the convent or the seminary.



What was not attractive was a special announcement that went like this: «IF YOU WANT TO BECOME A NOBODY, JOIN US».

Today the Church celebrates Palm Sunday, which inaugurates the most important week of the vear.

Today I opened the Bible and found many situations where Jesus became that Nobody and invites us, His followers, to become «Nobodies» like Him.

In Isaiah 52: «Like a sapling He grew up in front of us, like a root in arid ground, without beauty without majesty we saw him, no looks to attract our eyes, a thing despised and rejected by men, a

> man of sorrows and familiar with suffering, a man to make people screen their faces: he was despised and we took no account on him». The Lord has been pleased to crush him with suffering».

Ps. 30: «In the face of all my foes, I am a reproach and object of scorn to my neighbours and of fear to my friends. Those who see me in the streets run far away from me. I am like a dead man forgotten in men's hearts, like a thing thrown away.

Maranatha Baptist Mission La Romana, Dominican Republic - Brought to you by Jane House

During the first week of March, members of our community, Skip and Jane House, served as part of a Medical Mission and Construction Team, in La Romana, Dominican Republic. This was their 13th trip to serve the Haitian families, the men of which work in the sugar cane fields. As part of the Maranatha Baptist Church there have been teams going to serve these people for over thirty years. In addition to providing basic medical clinics which addresses the needs of women, children and the



elderly or infirmed men, who live in the village, the teams have been instrumental in providing skilled and unskilled labor and financial support to build a state-of-the-art hospital in La Romana. and ongoing teams and support of the medical clinics.



The Medical Clinic consist of 3 or 4 doctors, volunteers from the US, and/or from the hospital, paid by the team. Other volunteers take blood pressures, administer anti-parasitic juice to the children, or fill prescriptions in the portable pharmacy. Many take time out to bring toys and play with the children as well. The team purchases or brings donated hygiene supplies, clothing and food to distribute to each family processed through the clinic each day. It's definitely a labor of love where the Haitian people give as much to us as we give to them. We were blessed to have several young Haitian interpreters, who spoke

English, French, Creole and Spanish. They were amazing and truly became our friends. The Good Samaritan Hospital was the vision of Pastor Jean Luc Phenard, whose parishioner died in childbirth, when she was denied care at a Dominican hospital because she was Haitian. Sadly, Pastor Jean Luc was killed in a plane crash, in Queens, NY in Nov 2021, while on a trip to secure funds for the hospital. Loyal supporters, many Americans and local church members and friends, who had been involved from the start, continued to see his mission through to the end. Now the hospital is a modern four-story facility, with state-of-the-art dental clinic, surgical suite, radiology and dialysis, as well as emergency, physical therapy and routine in-patient care. Good Samaritan Hospital and the Maranatha Baptist Mission Medical Clinics continue to be built with faith, hope, hard work, charity and love.


