People Helping People is a small project founded in the Chapel of Penha de França to help those in need. Our former Bishop D. António once said, "One must find new ways of helping the poor". A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

#### CATHOLIC MASS - ENGLISH SERVICE

**Good morning!** Welcome to the Chapel of Our Lady of Penha de França. After many months away, we are blessed to have Father Bernardino celebrating Mass for us this morning! This English Service Mass is a tradition that dates back to 1966.



when Fr Rafael Andrade, having just returned from his first visit to England, complied with the Bishop's request to start an English celebration. Fr. Rafael presided this mass for over 30 years, when he had to stop in 1999 due to overlapping duties. For eight years there was no Mass in English in Madeira, until it began again on the first Sunday of Lent in 2007, celebrated by Fr. Bernardino.

#### **TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS**

(Acts 2:14,22-28; Psalm 15(16); 1 Peter 1:17-21; Luke 24:13-35)

Today and next Sunday we hear parts of Peter's speech at Pentecost. Peter emphasises that Jesus' death was part of God's plan, quoting the prophet Joel's words about the wonders expected in the last days, when God's Spirit will be poured out on all peoples. Jesus, a descendant of David is this expected "Anointed One", "Messiah" in Hebrew, "Christ" in Greek, who now rightfully succeeds David as King of Israel. **The Psalm**, attributed to King David, expresses total confidence in God, who will not let his soul die and will not let "your faithful one" suffer corruption in the grave. Both Peter, in today's reading, and Paul saw this as referring to Christ's resurrection. **Peter's first letter** reminds us of the price Jesus paid for our salvation in his suffering and death, so that we might "have faith and hope in God". We should persevere in hope, in face of attacks and attractions of secular society. In **the Gospel** Jesus appeared to the women. Then he joins two disciples walking despondently to Emmaus, and explains the scriptures to them, before they recognise him "at the breaking of bread". The appearances of Jesus after the resurrection invite us to listen carefully: he was clearly bodily present, not just a spirit. Yet he was different, and could only be recognised with faith.

#### **<u>PSALM RESPONSE</u>**: Show us, Lord, the path of life. Or: Alleluia!

### JESUS IS A DAILY SURPRISE FOR THOSE WHO ARE OPEN TO HIM

Karl Barth was a very famous Swiss Theologian of the 20 Century. He was Protestant but was very loved by all Christian Churches, including the Catholic Church.

Karl Barth was one day riding a streetcar in his home city of Basel, Switzerland. He took a seat close to a tourist, and the two men started chatting with one another. «Are vou

new to the city?» Barth inquired. «Yes» said the tourist. «Is there anything you would like particularly to see in the city?» asked Barth. «I would like to meet the famous Swiss Theologian Karl Barth, do you know him?» Barth answered: «As a matter of fact, I do know him. I give him a shave every morning». The tourist got off the street car at the next stop, quite delighted. He went back to his hotel and told everyone: «I met Karl Barth's barber today!».



This is the third Sunday of Easter. Easter is not a day. Easter is a season that starts on Easter Sunday and ends on Pentecost Sunday. That's the reason why we keep hearing in our Sunday Masses the fascinating Resurrection stories.



In the Bible there are many stories of God walking with people who didn't recognize Him, like the tourist who didn't recognize Karl Barth. After the Resurrection, this was very common. One of them was when two of Jesus' disciples left Jerusalem and took the road to Emmaus. It seems that they were husband and wife. They were very sad and depressed. For them the Cross had been a big failure. On their way home, a man going in the same direction joined them and their conversation, which was about Jesus of Nazareth. This man was the very own Jesus of Nazareth who explained everything that was supposed to happen to the Messiah. Because it was very

late, they invited Jesus to stay with them. And Jesus stayed with them. And the story continues saying that «Now while he was with them at the table, he took the bread and said the blessing, then he broke it and handed it to them. And their eyes were open and they recognized Him». (Lk.24: 13-35).

One thing that touches me the most is to see that the two disciples of Emmaus only recognized Jesus when the bread was broken.

We are surrounded by many poor. There are poor who never have a decent meal, others who are desperate because they have no money to buy medicine, to pay their rents, their electricity, their water. I know people who live permanently anxious for what they are going to feed their children tomorrow. A lady approached me one day and said: «Father, help me to find a job. No matter what kind of

job. In the last three days the only thing I am giving to my children is boiled guava leaves». That's why I feel so happy to worship with the community of Penha de França where every Sunday the members of the community «break the bread» with the poorest of the poor by donating part of their

«bread». I feel so happy where there is a Skip and Jane House who left the comfort of their homes to go to the Dominican Republic to help those who live in misery. I would like to invite Skip and Jane to give their testimony during one of our Sunday Masses.

### **CRIES OF THE POOR –** A heart of Gold

I am Alexandre, and I have been working with the charity "People Helping People" since it was first started. We are VERY thankful for the donations coming from your community, so we thought we could share with you some of the stories of the families you are helping to take care of. So, every week or so, I will talk shortly about a different family, and this week, we will talk about Mr. J.


Mr. J is a single man without children. He has a disfiguring health issue and he also had a stroke (although not severe, still a very disabling one). I can't think of any way that he could find a job that keeps him afloat, and yet, the government won't allow him a disability status. He recently lost his home, and we helped him find a 330€/month one room place. The cheapest we could find... Unfortunately,

since the landlord doesn't declare the rental, he is unable to request support for the rent anywhere. He spent some desperate times asking for a place in several government institutions, and they all replied the same thing, "get in line and wait". I know of a person that waited. It took 17 years for them to get her a home.

He had a small canoe that he used for fishing, and would sell to restaurants, but he lost that in the 20/02/2010 floods. He still goes fishing sometimes, catching fish, crabs or limpets on the shore to make some extra cash, but it's much harder to catch restaurant quality fish without a boat. If you meet him, you will find he is one of the sweetest people



you have ever met. He is very emotional, laughs and cries and will share everything he has with you, including the clothes on his back. He told us how when he was a child, when he walked back home from school, his eyes would be looking for the chimney of his house. If there was smoke, they would have dinner, if not, well I think you can guess what happened then.



And still, it's remarkable the willingness he has to share his things, and trust people around him. He is truly a kind soul. Your donations at the end of Mass make it possible for us to help him, and families like his.
