A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way. different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

(Acts 2:14,36-41; Psalm 22(23); 1 Peter 2:20-25; John 10:1-10)

Last Sunday we heard the middle section of Peter's speech at Pentecost, saying the Resurrection shows Jesus was the Holy One expected by King David. Today the consequences: many of his hearers accept this and are told they must repent and be baptised. "Repent" in the sense of radically changing their life and directing it towards God. Even though Jesus does not appear to baptise during his lifetime, baptism is immediately the mark of membership of the new Christian community, at which they receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Psalm celebrates God's loving care for his people, like a shepherd quarding and quiding his flock, who are looking forward to his generous end-time feast. Peter's letter continues: God's approval comes not from justifiable punishment but from suffering patiently even when we have done right. Christ patiently bore for us unjustified insults and hurts without retaliating, trusting completely in his Father. We must imitate the Lord our shepherd in every way, placing all our trust in him. He will "give us comfort" and "repose". In the Gospel John also sees Jesus as the Good Shepherd. He knows each one of us and leads us. We follow him because we know his voice. He is also the gate, through which we can enter and find safety.

PSALM RESPONSE: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

A SHEPHERD WHO KNOWS THE SHEPHERD

He was born and grew up in a poor and rural parish where he went to Catechism and made his First Communion. After his primary school, this boy went to the city where he was lucky to do his studies and become a great actor whose main performances were to recite classic and modern poems. One day he was invited to go to his former parish and perform for the congregation. The show was done inside the church which was big enough to accommodate lots of people. The church was packed. He recited many poems and people were delighted.

When he finished his program, the actor opened the show to the public announcing that «If you want me to recite any special poem, please feel free to do it. If I know it by heart, I will be happy to do it for you».

A few people requested special classic and modern poems and he was very successful in knowing all of them and, of course, did an incredible job.

Standing almost at the back of the church was his former Pastor who had given him Religion classes, his first Communion, and was still the Pastor of the same Parish. He raised his hand and asked the actor to please recite the Psalm 23



«The Lord is my Shepherd». The actor

obliged to do it, but before starting he put one condition which was: «Father, I will be happy to recite the Psalm 23 but with one condition: if you come after me and do the same psalm». Both agreed even though the priest was feeling very shy, knowing perfectly that he was not going to do a good job compared with his former parishioner.

The moment arrived. The actor started reciting the Psalm 23:

«The Lord is my Shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. / Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose. / Near restful waters he leads me, to revive my drooping spirit...»... It was the most thrilling moment of the night. He didn't miss one word.

People standing, hardly stopped clapping and

applauding. When everybody was in silence, the actor kindly invited the old and humble priest to approach the microphone saying: «Father, now it is your turn, please». The Pastor had no choice and approached the microphone. He crossed his fingers as he used to do in prayer, bowed his head and closed his eyes. With a soft voice he started: «The Lord is my Shepherd there is nothing I shall want» and then recited the entire psalm. He forgot and stumbled in a few words but finished the psalm. When he finished nobody applauded. The silence was very heavy and most of the people were in tears. After a few moments the actor interrupted the silence and said: «Do you know the difference between me and this man? The difference between me and this man is that I know the Psalm but he knows the Shepherd».





The Shepherd knew the Shepherd and that was the reason why he made such a difference in that congregation.

Today, the fourth Sunday of Easter is the Sunday of the Good Shepherd. We are all invited to follow the Good Shepherd but we are also invited to be good shepherds for our family members and for all around us. Let us be good to them.


MADEIRA FLOWER FESTIVAL - parade today at 4pm in Funchal
