A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way. different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

CATHOLIC MASS - ENGLISH SERVICE

Good morning! The special intention of this morning's Holy Mass is for the soul of Maria Zizina de Freitas Marques, who attended Mass at our chapel for many years with her family. She passed away unexpectedly 5 years ago. 1

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS - 6th Sunday of Easter, Year A

(Acts 8:5-8,14-17; Psalm 65(66); 1 Peter 3:15-18 or 4:13-16; John 14:15-21 or 17:1-11)

After Stephen had been killed, Saul led "a great persecution" against the Church in Jerusalem. The Hellenists were therefore driven out of Jerusalem and Philip takes the gospel to Samaria. Peter and John came to investigate these first non-Jew converts. The apostles confirmed these new members by laying hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit. The Psalm praises God's power as revealed throughout history but especially during the Exodus. Peter continues his advice to Christians suffering abuse and ridicule from their non-Christian neighbours. Do not be afraid! Stick to your principles, being ready to explain your reasons politely. And rejoice that your sufferings enable you to share in Christ's sufferings so that you may share in his glory. In John's Gospel description of the Last Supper, Jesus promises to send the Holy Spirit to continue his work after he returns to his Father. The supper ends with Jesus' great prayer to his Father for the Church he is leaving behind. All three persons of the Trinity are mentioned in the gospels, but the Church only gradually developed its understanding of the Trinity over many centuries. We believe that the Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son (filioque). The Orthodox Church says that the Spirit comes from the Father through the



CHRISTIANITY, THE OPPOSITE OF LONELINESS

1 - I WILL NEVER LEAVE YOU ORPHANS

«I will never leave you orphans. I will come back to you» (Jo. 14). This is one of the most encouraging messages Jesus offers to his apostles. This is one of the most



encouraging messages Jesus offers to each one of us. We will never be alone. «My Father will give you another Advocate to be with you forever» (Jo. 14:16)

2 - I AM NOT AFRAID IF HE IS LIKE MY DAD

There is a touching story told of a humble, consecrated pastor, whose young son had become very ill. After the boy had undergone an exhaustive series of tests, the father was told the shocking news that his son had a terminal illness. The youngster had accepted Christ as his Saviour, so the minister knew that death would usher him into glory: but he wondered how to inform one in the bloom

of youth that soon he would die. After earnestly seeking the direction of the Holy Spirit, he went with a heavy heart through the hospital ward to the boy's bedside. First, he read a passage of Scripture and had a time of prayer with his dear child. Then he gently told him that the doctors could promise him only a few more days to live. "Are you afraid to meet Jesus, my boy?" asked his devout father. Blinking away a few tears, the little fellow said bravely, "No, not if He's like you, Dad!" (Fr. Lakra).



3 - ON THE OTHER SIDE OF A FALLEN TREE

In one primitive culture, all the adolescents had to pass through a special ceremony which today we would call "a test", in order to become adults. In this particular culture, the ceremony was apparently simple but in reality, was terrifying. This was what happened to one particular boy. He was an adolescent and through that ceremony he was going to become an adult. His father accompanied him to a mountain. They walked together at the end of the day when night was falling. Arriving at this special place, his father explained to him the ceremony that he was going to go through.



«My son, first I am going to blindfold you. Then you are going to sit down at the end of

this fallen tree. You will spend all night with your blindfold on, and you can only take it off when you start perceiving the beginning of the sunrise. Then you can take your blindfold and go home.



When you take your blindfold off, you will know that you are a man. You are not a child anymore. Are you ready?» The son had no choice but to say: "Yes father". "Good bye son". "Good bye father". Then, seated at the end of that fallen tree the boy started what was going to be the most terrifying night of his life. **The darkness was thick.** He knew that there were wild animals walking around. He knew that there were snakes that could kill him in seconds. There were night birds making strange noises, but the most terrifying aspect was that he could not, under no circumstances, take his blindfold off before the sunrise. That night felt like an eternity. He felt so lonely. Finally, when he felt the first signs of light, he knew that it was time to take his blindfold off and go home.

Yes, it was time. He was already a man. He had passed, what we would call today, "the test". He felt relieved and a little dizzy, and started looking around. Finally, after having survived the most terrifying night of his life, he had the happiest moment of his life. When looking around, he saw that on the other end of the fallen tree sat his father, looking back at him with a big smile. His father had spent the whole night at his side, seated on the other end of the fallen tree. Hs father had not left him alone, not even for one moment.

God is that father who is always seated on the same fallen tree, even if we are blindfolded and feel that around us everything is dark and scary. God is there even when we blame Him for our tests and our darkness that sometimes happens in our lives. God never abandons us even when we have to pass through very frightening tests. «I WILL NEVER LEAVE YOU ORPHANS».
