People Helping People is a small project founded in the Chapel of Penha de França to help those in need. Our former Bishop D. António once said, "One must find new ways of helping the poor". A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

#### <u>CATHOLIC MASS – 10 AM SERVICE</u> (IN ENGLISH)

Good morning! Welcome to the Chapel of Our Lady of Penha de França which was founded by Antonio Dantas in 1622. Father Bernardino Andrade is our priest who celebrates this *Catholic Mass in English* every Sunday morning here at the Chapel at 10h00. Masses in Portuguese are celebrated on Saturdays at 18h30 and Sundays at 11h30.

#### **TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS** – 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A

(1 Kgs 3:5,7-12; Ps 118(119); Rom 8:28-30; Mt 13:44-52)

After David's death his son, Solomon, became king. Until Solomon built the Temple, sacrificing to God in high places was acceptable. It was during one such sacrifice that God appeared in a dream asking Solomon what he most wanted. In humility Solomon asked for a discerning judgement, rightly earning God's praise. **The Psalm** praises God's law as the supreme rule for life because it is designed to help us become who we are meant to be. Paul continues describing life in the Spirit to the **Romans**. Christians should try to reproduce in themselves images of Christ by progressively sharing in his risen life. God prepares those called to do his work and cooperates with them. Each individual is called for some task in God's plan for salvation. Those who love him will share in his glory. This includes not only Christians and others of goodwill, but also the Jews, "the ones he chose specially long ago".

**Matthew's Gospel** compares the Kingdom of Heaven to the greatest treasure found either accidentally or after a search, and then compares the Kingdom to a dragnet: the good fish will be kept and those of no use will be thrown in the furnace. There is a surprise ending: not all old treasures should be thrown away, some should be kept – like Israel's Scriptures, our Old Testament.

We are VERY thankful for the donations coming from your community, so we thought we could share with you some of the stories of the families you are helping to take care of.



This week I have a very special request for all of you.


We are always seeking ways to get our families out of poverty. Most times, they are in a very complex position where many different aspects need to be dealt with in order for them to be truly "liberated" from poverty. But sometimes, we have a real shot to make that happen.



Some time ago, I wrote about Mr. J. and his kind soul. He used to catch fish to sell to restaurants. It was not a comfortable income, but it was enough for his spartan living. And it was plenty for him because he really is a man in love with the sea. He is a fisherman at heart. I went fishing with him a few years ago. We went to Ribeira Brava and it was clear how happy he was, just being there, fishing for hours.

He lost his canoe in the 2010 storm, and never had a chance to purchase another one.

All this to say, that we found a nice, used canoe! I asked him to check it out last Saturday (22/07), he confirmed that it has everything legally needed, a small working engine, and it even has license until 2027! It's ready to go into the sea.





the needs of the people we help, it's even more complicated for a nonextreme-survival-need expense... And it's much more money than we can handle anyway...

At this moment, PHP has 0.85€ in its bank account. All your donations are usually used immediately. That is why I cannot ask you to switch from giving to the PHP families, to giving to this specific project.

So what I'm asking is, if you can help this "extra" cause, please help us get this man a minimum actual proper living. It's the proverbial "give a man a fish" saying, but this time we can solve it with a canoe. You can donate directly into the PHP bank account, but add a comment to the transfer, mentioning anything from "To Mr. J" to simply "boat". If you donate through Mrs. Sinead, just ask her to add that information into the transfer.

These donations will remain as a separate fund, exclusively for the purchase of the canoe, and as soon as we reach the 2000€ we will let you know! If we get any amount over the objective, we will use it for Mr. J. to purchase fishing equipment appropriate for fishing on the canoe.

We have it reserved until the 5th of August, and of course, I'm not sure how long they will hold the reserve after that.
