A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

CATHOLIC MASS – 10 AM – (SERVICE IN ENGLISH)

Good morning, and welcome! The Chapel of Our Lady of Penha de França was founded by Antonio Dantas in 1622. The English Mass is a tradition that dates back to 1966 when Fr Rafael Andrade, having

just returned from his first visit to England, complied with the Bishop's request to start an English celebration on the island of Madeira.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS – 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A

(Isaiah 25:6-10; Psalm 22(23) r.6; Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20; Matthew 22:1-14)

After the desolation of the earth and the final judgement, **Isaiah** describes in mouth-watering detail the great banquet the Lord will provide. It will be on Mount Zion and all peoples are invited. Not only will all sorrows be wiped away, but also the ultimate worry – death – will be destroyed. The familiar **Psalm** expresses our personal confidence that the Lord is preparing a beautiful surprise for us to enjoy after death. Our readings from Paul's letter to the **Philippians** conclude with Paul again thanking them for their continued support and the money they had sent him. God's help enables him to be content whatever his problems, but their thoughtfulness is especially welcome now that he is in prison. He ends his letter with a fond farewell: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit". **Matthew** compares the kingdom of heaven to a wedding feast - the heavenly banquet to which all are invited. But if we accept the invitation we must prepare adequately and be willing to participate fully. Otherwise, we may still be thrown out. Our membership must be visible to others. We must do more than just belong. Like the Philippians we must share what we have with the community we have joined, and with those in need.

Cohen asked the Rabbi If he were offended at having been given a gift as a sign of a Christian holiday. Smiling, the Rabbi shook his head and answered: - "No! I was shedding tears of joy to be in such a wonderful country in which a Chinese Buddhist restaurant owner gives a Russian Jew a Christmas gift made by a Hindu in India".

The first clear historical reference to the rosary is from the life of St. Dominic (1170-1221), founder of the Dominicans. He preached a form of rosary in France.

One of his future disciples, Alan de la Roche (1428-1475), began to establish Rosary Confraternities to promote the

praying of the rosary. The form of the rosary we have today

is believed to date from his time.

In 1569, Pope Pius V (also a Dominican) issued an

apostolic letter establishing the fifteen-Mystery form of the

rosary as the official, Church-authorized version, which was

used for the next four centuries. In 2002, Pope John Paull II published an apostolic letter

that added five more Mysteries: the Luminious Mysteries.

'Go to the Madonna. Love her! Always say the rosary. Say it well. Say it as often as you can! Be souls of prayer. Never tire of praying, it is what is essential. Prayer shakes the Heart of God, it obtains necessary graces!"
