People Helping People is a small project founded in the Chapel of Penha de França to help those in need. Our former Bishop D. António once said, "One must find new ways of helping the poor". A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

### CATHOLIC MASS – 10 AM (IN ENGLISH)

Good morning. Today is the 2nd Sunday of Lent.
Father Joseph Arun will be celebrating Mass for us this morning. Father Joseph is originally from India, and has been serving as a priest in the Carmo church (*Igreja do Carmo*) in Madeira since 2019.



#### **TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS** – 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Lent - Year B

(Genesis 22:1-2,9-18; Psalm 115(116):10.15-19; Romans 8:31-34; Mark 9: 2-10)

In Genesis God sets a greater test of Abraham's faith than might appear: Isaac seems now to be Abraham's only son. His wife, Sarah, had persuaded Abraham to drive out into the desert his other son, Ishmael, with her mother, Hagar, the slave woman. God had promised Abraham would be father of a host of nations, with as many descendants as stars in the sky. How could this now come about? On the way Isaac had asked "Where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" Abraham answered: "God will provide himself". Abraham's faith is rewarded and God renews his covenant. The Psalmist offers sacrifice and grateful praise after God heard his prayer at death's door. Paul urges the Romans to have similar trust in God. That God gave up his only Son to death shows how completely God loves us. Paul insists that nothing can separate us from the love of God. In our last reading from Mark's gospel until the Ascension, the disciples appear confused by Jesus' transfiguration. Although God has again confirmed Jesus as his Son, they do not understand how Jesus relates to Moses and Elijah, representing the Law and the Prophets. After Jesus' resurrection they would realise Jesus had come to fulfil the whole of Israel's scriptures.

#### LENT IS A SEASON FOR LEARNING ABOUT LOVE

As a Carmelite priest from Kerala, India, I arrived in Madeira in August 2019. Nearly a year after my arrival, while attending a meeting of the priests in the Diocese of Funchal, I had the pleasure of meeting a priest from Madeira who spoke English. He conversed with me warmly, showing care and concern. During our discussion, he asked me if I celebrate Mass in English, to which I responded affirmatively. He then proceeded to tell me about the English-speaking community at the Chapel of Penha da França. The priest I spoke with was Fr. Bernardino.

After that meeting with Fr. Bernardino, we began

communicating through mobile phones and occasionally in person. On days when he was bedridden, he would call me to celebrate Mass at the Penha de França Chapel. Over time, my connection with Fr. Bernardino and the Penha de França Chapel grew stronger. I started learning and speaking Portuguese, and last year, by the grace and providence of God, I was appointed as the Superior of the Carmelite Monastery in Funchal, known as *Igreja do Carmo*. Despite my new responsibilities, my good relationship with Fr. Bernardino persisted. Myself and another community member, Fr. Thomas, were able to assist him while he was sick.

The news of the demise of Fr. Bernardino was a shock for me, as it was for all of us. We miss him dearly, and the Catholic Church has lost a humble, lovable, and good-hearted pastor. He considered everyone as his family member. I believe nobody can forget him if they spent even a little time with him. He used to transmit positive energy with his smiling face. Nobody can replace him. Once, when he was sick, I visited him, and the moment he asked for a blessing from me, I can never forget. He was such a humble personality. He used to write good thoughts in this newsletter. With that inspiration, I also share some



thoughts on the Lenten season with you through this newsletter.

As we embark on this journey through the season of Lent, it is a time for reflection, introspection, and growth. Lent is not merely about giving up something we enjoy; it is about delving deeper into our spirituality, our relationships, and our capacity to love. #### MASS LAST SUNDAY IN "BICA DA CANA" - in honour of Fr. Bernardino

Last Sunday afternoon, a special Mass in honour of Father Bernardino's life was celebrated in the «Cantinho do Bom Pastor» a shrine located in *Bica da Cana*, in the forest area of Paul da Serra. This shrine, which has a small statue of the Good Shepherd inside, held a special place in Father Bernardino's heart. He had it constructed, and gave it the name of "Cantinho do Bom Pastor" (Little corner of the Good Shepherd), which was inaugurated by the Bishop of Funchal on September 12, 2020, in a special Mass.



Last Sunday's Mass was celebrated by Fr. António Paulo, the parish priest of Assomada. There were about 60 people who attended the Mass, many of whom were crying as they remembered Father Bernardino.

Afterwards some traditional music was played, and everyone enjoyed some Madeiran food and delicious homemade cake.

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## PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE (PHP)

#### Hello friends,

I'm sure many of you know that if you asked Fr. Bernardino what is "People Helping People", he would first tell you it is a way of life, and then he would tell you it is also a Charity...

His idea for this kind of Charity started in the US, when a lady that lived in a small home called him, and asked if he knew of anyone that had an old dryer she could have as hers was broken, and she couldn't afford to fix it. He said he didn't, but he would keep her in

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mind in case something came up. A few hours later, a man called saying he had an old, but still working dryer to offer in case he knew someone who needed it!

Of course, my Uncle was radiant with this coincidence! You all know how precious these "little miracles" were to him.

So in few weeks, he cleared a big space in the parish, and made known that everything that people didn't need, they could leave it there, and if anyone needed anything, they could simply come by and take what they needed, no questions asked. Of course, it evolved into something bigger than that, and eventually they were even distributing meals. And that is precisely what he felt was happening, it was simply *People* Helping *People* as a way of life.

So that was what he decided to do here in Madeira after those terrible floods in 2010, and the attention he had for our most fragile brothers and sisters.

Of course, we never had a big space we could use as warehouse as he did in the US. We don't even have a small space of our own! All we have is lent or offered.

His Charity is simply the intermediary between *People* who want to Help other *People*. That is why his favourite reference was the Good Shepherd Jesus, the One who taught us to care for each other, the One who reminds us that no one stays behind, the One who told us that whatever you do for your weaker brothers and sisters, you do it for Him.

We have all been mourning Fr. Bernardino for the last few weeks. It's been strange carrying on in his absence. But of course, the Charity he founded has continued its work. Many of you certainly heard about how he was afraid that "People Helping People" would end with his death. I promised him that I would not allow that to happen. Two weeks ago, I held a meeting with some volunteers, who are all dedicated to making sure it keeps on running, growing and flourishing into the Charity that Fr. Bernardino dreamt of. And so, it is my privilege and honour to announce that our charity's name will be changed to "Gente Ajudando Gente - Associação Pe. Bernardino de Solidariedade Social" meaning "People Helping People - Fr. Bernardino Social Solidarity Association".

I know he would plead to keep the "People Helping People" part. As for him, it was a way of life. It's simply what we should do when someone needs help. He would certainly be very embarrassed to see his name on it, but since he can't deny us, we're going for it. It just feels right. He is not only its founder, he is also the mentor at the heart of everything we do, and the way we do it in the Charity. It is truly his Association. I know it is a big name. maybe even a bit clumsy, but there are things we can't take

out legally (Social Solidarity Association), there are things we didn't want to take out (People Helping People), and something I feel strongly everyone agrees to add, is Father Bernardino's name.

I like it, and I hope you like it too.
