A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way. different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).

### CATHOLIC MASS – 10 AM (IN ENGLISH)



Good morning! On the 4th Sunday of Easter, called Good Shepherd Sunday, we continue to reflect on the meaning of the Resurrection. This is also the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The special intention of this morning's Mass will be for the soul of Manuel António Gomes. Our priest this morning is Father Joseph Arun, who is originally from Kerala, India, and has been serving as a priest in Madeira since 2019 in the Carmo church (Igreja do Carmo) in Funchal.

### TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS - 4th Sunday of Easter

(Acts 4: 8-12 : Psalm 117(118): 1 John 3: 1-2 : John 10: 11-18)

After healing the cripple in Jesus' name and calling on the people to repent, Peter and John were put in prison overnight. Peter then repeats his preaching to the Jewish leaders. The leaders cannot deny "a notable miracle has been worked". Undecided, they order the Apostles not to speak in Jesus' name again, and release them without punishing them - at least this time. The Psalm is from the Passover Psalm heard on Easter Sunday, thanking and praising God for repeatedly saving us. John's first letter insists that the love the Father has given us makes us his children now, anticipating already in some way what we shall be "when he appears". John goes on to contrast the righteous who do not sin with those who commit sin. You are either for God or against him - there is nothing between. In John's gospel, after healing the man born blind. Jesus describes himself both as the door through which we can enter and be saved, and also as the good shepherd, whom the sheep know and follow. In contrast to the false shepherds criticised by Ezekiel, the good shepherd cares for his sheep, even at the cost of his life. Jesus emphasises that he is in control of his life, causing division among the Jews.

**PSALM RESPONSE:** The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone.



# He Knows The Shepherd

Years ago the great actor Richard Burton was given a grand reception in his childhood parish. While replying to the complimentary speeches in the parish auditorium he asked if there was anything they specially wanted to hear from him. After a few minute's pause his old pastor asked him if he could recite the Good Shepherd Psalm (Psalm 23), which he had taught Burton in his Sunday school. A strange look came over the actor's face.

He paused for a moment, and then said: - «I will, on one condition – that after I have recited it, you, my pastor and teacher, will do the same».

- «I» said the old, retired pastor, «I am not an actor, but, if you wish it, I shall do so.» Impressively the actor began the Psalm. His voice and intonation were perfect. He held his audience spellbound, and, as he finished, a great burst of applause broke from the audience.

As it died away, the old pastor rose from his wheel chair and began to recite the same psalm. His voice was feeble and shivering and his tone was not faultless. When he finished, nobody applauded but there was not a dry eye in the room. There was a period of profound silence. Then the actor rose and his voice quivered as he said:

- «Ladies and gentlemen, I reached your eyes and ears, but my old pastor has reached your hearts. The difference is just this: I know the Psalm but he knows the Shepherd».

This is the Good Shepherd Sunday, Jesus wants us to know Him by experiencing Him, not just loving Him but being intimate with Him and to become Good Shepherds to those entrusted to our care.
