In a short period of time we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

The Mission Statement of People Helping People is... through social solidarity, to mobilize many people to help many people in a combat against poverty, hunger, illness, exclusion, indifference, intolerance, and social injustice, with a special preference for the last, the least and the lost, having as a model the person of Jesus, the «Good Shepherd» (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 15). Our wish is that it may always be an open door when all the other doors close, building in this way, different feelings and acts of Mercy (Gospel according to Luke, chapter 6 and Matthew chapter 25).



CATHOLIC MASS - 10 AM (IN ENGLISH)



Good morning! Today is the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time. We are blessed by the presence of two dedicated priests


who celebrate Mass here at the Chapel in English for us on Sundays: Father Joseph Arun, and Father Thomas Muzhuthett, both originally from Kerala, India. Last Sunday we were also blessed with the presence of Rev. Deacon Michael Smith, from the UK, who was here on holiday in Madeira.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS – 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B (*Job* 38: 1, 8-11; *Psalm* 106(107): 23-26, 28-31; *2 Corinthians* 5: 14-17; *Mark* 4: 35-41)

Satan said that if **Job** lost all that he valued he would curse God. So, Satan was permitted to test Job in this way. After losing everything Job laments his losses, asking why God has treated him - a just man - so badly. Eventually God answers at great length - a beautiful hymn of praise to God's power over and in all creation, confirming that God is indeed "greater than any mortal". **The psalm** praises God for helping and rescuing storm-tossed seafarers. The writer of the **2nd Letter to the Corinthians** has said he would prefer to be with the Lord, who has rescued him from near despair, but nevertheless he accepts that he is required to do further work on earth. But in doing this he - and the Corinthians - must constantly have in mind the new creation they have become, now they know the risen Christ. So, he does not lose heart, even though people might have thought God is no longer caring for him. Job and the psalm provide a fitting background for Mark's description of Jesus stilling the storm. But in **Mark's gospel** the disciples do not understand: they cannot make the connection to the lesson learned so painfully by Job. They do not yet have faith that he will care for them - even when asleep! Understanding can come only after Jesus' death on the cross.

<u>PSALM RESPONSE</u>: O give thanks to the Lord, for his love endures for ever.



Carlo Acutis will be a Saint

Pope Francis will preside over a public Ordinary Consistory on July 1 of this year in which, among others, the date on which Blessed Carlo Acutis will be proclaimed a saint will be announced. On May 23, the Holy Father approved a miracle attributed to the intercession of Blessed Carlo Acutis, the Italian teenager who died at the age of 15 and was beatified in 2020 in Assisi. With this new decree, the young man who deeply loved the Eucharist will be proclaimed a saint. In the same statement with the decrees approved by the Holy Father, it was also reported that the Pontiff had convened a consistory to determine the dates of canonization of Carlo Acutis and Blesseds Giuseppe Allamano, Marie-Léonie Paradis, and Elena Guerra.
