We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming...

THE CATHOLIC MASS IN ENGLISH

Good morning! Merry Christmas! Today, on the first Sunday after Christmas, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. We are blessed to have mass in English celebrated every week by Father Joseph Arun or Father Thomas Muzhuthett, who are both Carmelite priests originally from Kerala, India.They have carried on the English service Mass for us since Father Bernardino's passing, for which we are all very grateful.



TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS – Holy Family, Sunday after Christmas – Year C (*I Samuel* 1:20-22.24-28; *Psalm* 83(84); *I John* 3:1-2.21-24; *Luke* 2:41-52)



Hannah was constantly tormented for her barrenness by Elkanah's other wife. Every year, they went on pilgrimage to Shiloh, where the Ark of the Covenant resided. One year Hannah prayed for a long time, promising the Lord that if he granted her request for a son, she would dedicate him to the Lord. The priest Eli added his prayers to hers. After **Samuel** was born,

Hannah took him to Shiloh and left him with Eli, dedicated to the Lord, where later he was called as a prophet. **The Psalm** expresses intense longing to experience the Lord's presence in his Temple. The first letter of **John** was written near the end of the first century against false ideas that were being spread, especially that Jesus was not truly man. Jesus – "what we have seen" "and touched with our hands" – was true man, the greatest gift of the Father. And the Father has made us his children. We will know in truth that we belong to him if we keep his commandments. Knowledge of God and love for one another are inseparable. **Luke's** story of the boy Jesus in the Temple poses the question: did the human child Jesus show divine knowledge and powers before his baptism, when God proclaimed him as his Son and he started his ministry?

In last year's newsletter on the Feast of the Holy Family, Father Bernardino asked Deacon Tito to write about something that he experienced as a child when his family moved to England, from Madeira. This is what Deacon Tito wrote:



HOW LARGE IS YOUR FAMILY? - By Deacon Tito Pereira

Upon my arrival in England and commencement of school, the teacher initiated a discussion about family size within the class. Responses varied one child mentioned four members, another three, and so forth. I distinctly recall marvelling at what seemed to me like remarkably small family units. When the teacher turned to me and inquired about my own family size, I hesitated, admitting uncertainty but suggesting it might exceed 100 members. A wave of laughter engulfed the classroom as the teacher dismissed my estimate as ridiculous. In my mind, family encompassed not

only parents and siblings but also grandparents, great aunts and uncles, aunts, uncles, and cousins. This expansive definition was met with skepticism in the classroom that day. **Upon** recounting the incident to my mother, she dismissed the teacher's reaction as absurd,

asserting that our extended family likely exceeded three or four hundred individuals. As the years passed, I came to recognise that the concept of family extended beyond blood relations. As a Christian, I embraced a global family of brothers and sisters, and I began to appreciate an even broader perspective - **that all individuals are children of God.** This revelation expanded my understanding of family far beyond the confines of a mere headcount.


GRANDPARENTS ARE A TREASURE
