People Helping People is a small project founded in the Chapel of Penha de França by the late Father Bernardino Andrade to help those in need. Our former Bishop D. António once said, "One must find new ways of helping the poor". A very small group of people attending the English Mass decided to do just that after the floods in 2010! In a short period of time, we created partnerships with supermarket chains and restaurants; we have paid dozens of medical prescriptions, we have spent gallons and gallons of petrol riding across the island giving lifts, we have prevented families from going hungry, getting their electricity cut off, running out of gas, losing their homes. We have tried to keep them warm, keep them hopeful, and keep them dreaming. -

## THE CATHOLIC MASS IN ENGLISH

Good morning. Today we celebrate the 3rd Sunday of Lent. Located in the heart of the city of Funchal, the Chapel of Our Lady of Penha de Franca was built in the 17th century by António Dantas, making it 403 years old this year. A Catholic Mass is held here in English at the Chapel every Sunday morning at 10am.

## TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS - 3rd Sunday of Lent

(Exodus 3: 1-8, 13-15; Psalm 102 (103); 1 Corinthians 10: 1-6, 10-12; Luke 13: 1-9)

The book of **Exodus** describes how a group of Hebrew slaves becomes a nation unified by faith in the one God, who made a covenant with them. After killing an Egyptian, Moses fled across the Red Sea. He was given refuge by Jethro, marrying his daughter, Zipporah. In today's reading Moses is called by God to his life's task of leading the Hebrews to the promised land. God reveals his name as "being": he exists and involves himself with us. All creation is invited to join in this Psalm - a tender hymn of thanksgiving for the Lord's mercy, which is so great because he knows man's frailty. Paul warns the Corinthians not to be over confident in their faith. Even with God's continual support and unifying nourishment, the Israelites many times fell away from the covenant and into idolatry. Paul goes on to urge respect for the Eucharist. The sacraments help us to live our lives of faith, but salvation is not automatic. In Luke's Gospel Jesus continues teaching his disciples on the journey to Jerusalem. He uses examples of sudden death that his hearers would be aware of, to urge repentance and keeping one's life oriented towards God at all times. With the parable of the fig tree Jesus says God is patient, but judgement will come.

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## **REFLECTION FOR THE 3RD SUNDAY OF LENT** – By De

When I was staying in *Rochinha* last year (a small neighbourhood in Funchal), there was a *nespereira*, a loquat tree, in the garden. Year after

year, it grew but never bore any fruit. One of my cousins suggested cutting it down, believing it was a waste of space. Yet another cousin gently objected, saying, "All it needs is a little love." After I returned to the UK, months passed, and then one day, my cousin sent me a



photo. There it was - the tree, covered in fruit. I am glad it got a second chance.

In today's Gospel, we hear of the barren fig tree. For three years, it has borne no fruit, and the logical response might be to cut it down. Yet, the gardener intercedes, pleading for one more year, offering to tend to it with care and patience. This image of mercy mirrors the heart of God - the great "I Am" who is not distant or indifferent but present, full of compassion and love. When Moses encounters God in the burning bush, the Lord reveals Himself as "I Am Who Am," the One who exists eternally and who is always with His people. This divine presence is not one of fear or condemnation but of steadfast love. Just as God heard the cries of His people in Egypt and responded with deliverance, so too does He hear our own cries and longs to set us free.



Lent is a time of renewal, a season when we are called to examine our hearts and seek conversion. But it is also a time to encounter the tenderness of God's love. Like the fig tree, we may sometimes feel barren, burdened by our failings or distant from God. Yet the Lord never gives up on us. He draws near, offering nourishment through the sacraments, strengthening us with His grace, and calling us to deeper intimacy with Him.

To stand before the cross is to witness the revelation of the **I** Am - the God who chooses to suffer for love of us. Christ's sacrifice, in His compassion and love, is the ultimate sign of God's enduring presence. Through His wounds, we are healed, and through His resurrection, we are given new life.

Today, we are also reminded of our call to mirror God's compassion in our own lives. The


patience of the gardener challenges us to be patient with one another, to offer forgiveness, and to bear with each other's weaknesses. In a world often quick to judge and slow to understand, we are called to respond with kindness and mercy.

May this Lent be a time of renewal for us all. Let us draw closer to the I Am through prayer, fasting, and acts of charity. And may the love we receive from Him overflow into our relationships, so that we may become instruments of His compassion in our families, communities, and the world.

And hopefully, when I return to Madeira, I will sample the fruits of the nespereira!
